IMPORTANT INFORMATION

This prospectus (the “**Prospectus**”) has been prepared by Vostok New Ventures Ltd (the “**Company**” or the “**Issuer**”), registration number 39861, in relation to the application for listing of bonds issued under the Company’s maximum SEK 600,000,000 senior unsecured callable fixed rate bonds 2018/2022 with ISIN SE0011337294 (the “**Bonds**”), of which SEK 400,000,000 was issued on 14 June 2018 (the “**Issue Date**”) in accordance with the terms and conditions for the Bonds (the “**Terms and Conditions**”) (the “**Initial Bond Issue**”), on the Corporate Bond List at Nasdaq Stockholm AB (“**Nasdaq Stockholm**”). Concepts and terms defined in the Terms and Condition are used with the same meaning in this Prospectus unless otherwise is explicitly understood from the context. The Issuer may at one or more occasions after the Issue Date issue Subsequent Bonds under the Terms and Conditions, until the total amount under such Subsequent Bond Issue(s) and the Initial Bond Issue equals SEK 600,000,000. Subsequent Bonds may, for the avoidance of doubt, be admitted to trading pursuant to this Prospectus within one year after the approval of this Prospectus by the Swedish Financial Supervisory Authority. References to “**Vostok**” or the “**Group**” refer in this Prospectus to the Company and its subsidiaries from time to time, unless otherwise indicated by the context. References to “**SEK**” refer to the lawful currency of Sweden. See section “*Definitions*” below for definitions of certain other terms in this Prospectus.

This Prospectus has been prepared in accordance with the rules and regulations in the Swedish Financial Instruments Trading Act (Sw. *lag (1991:980) om handel med finansiella instrument*) and Commission Regulation (EC) No 809/2004 of 29 April 2004 implementing Directive 2003/71/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council, each as amended. This Prospectus has been approved by and registered with the Swedish Financial Supervisory Authority (Sw. *Finansinspektionen*) in accordance with the provisions in Chapter 2, Sections 25 and 26, of the Swedish Financial Instruments Trading Act. It should be noted that such approval and such registration does not constitute any guarantee from the Swedish Financial Supervisory Authority that the information in this Prospectus is accurate or complete.

This Prospectus is not an offer for sale or a solicitation of an offer to purchase the Bonds in any jurisdiction. It has been prepared solely for the purpose of listing the Bonds on Nasdaq Stockholm. This Prospectus may not be distributed in any country where distribution requires additional prospectus, registration or additional measures or is contrary to local rules and regulations. Persons into whose possession this Prospectus comes or persons who acquire the Bonds are therefore required to inform themselves about, and to observe, such restrictions. The Bonds have not been and will not be registered under the U.S. Securities Act of 1933, as amended (the “**Securities Act**”), or any U.S. state securities laws and may be subject to U.S. tax law requirements. Subject to certain exemptions, the Bonds may not be offered, sold or delivered within the United States of America or to, or for the account or benefit of, U.S. persons (as defined in Rule 902 of Regulation S under the Securities Act). The Company has not undertaken to register the Bonds under the Securities Act or any U.S. state securities laws or to affect any exchange offer for the Bonds in the future. Furthermore, the Company has not registered the Bonds under any other country’s securities laws. It is the investor’s obligation to ensure that the offers and sales of Bonds comply with all applicable securities laws.

The Prospectus is available at the Swedish Financial Supervisory Authority’s web page (www.fi.se) and the Company’s web page (www.vostoknewventures.com), and paper copies may be obtained from the Company.

Unless otherwise expressly stated, no information contained in this Prospectus has been audited or reviewed by the Company’s auditors. Certain financial information in this Prospectus may have been rounded off and, as a result, the numerical figures shown as totals in this Prospectus may vary slightly from the exact arithmetic aggregation of the figures that precede them.

This Prospectus may contain forward-looking statements and assumptions regarding future market conditions, operations and results. Such forward-looking statements and information are based on the beliefs of the Company’s management or are assumptions based on information available to the Group. The words “considers”, “intends”, “deems”, “expects”, “anticipates”, “plans” and similar expressions indicate some of these forward-looking statements. Any forward-looking statements in this Prospectus involve known and unknown risks, uncertainties and other factors which may cause the actual results, performances or achievements of the Group to be materially different from any future results, performances or achievements expressed or implied by such forward-looking statements. B.4b	Tendencies	<p>Apart from the following tendencies, which based on the Company’s opinion, the Company is not aware of any tendencies that, directly or indirectly, has materially affected or materially would affect the Company’s operations.</p> <p>As an increasing number of people have gained access to the internet, the marketplaces have migrated from the local marketplace to the internet. Consequently, the line between local and global has started to dissolve, and buyers and sellers are today only a click away from each other, despite long geographical distances.</p> <p>In developed countries with a high level of internet penetration, the migration to online marketplaces has reached a high maturity with several multi-billion dollar companies such as eBay, Amazon and Airbnb. In many emerging markets the level of internet penetration lags far behind that of the more developed countries. While the internet penetration in these regions is still low, for example in the area surrounding the Middle East and North Africa and CIS region, it has increased rapidly and is expected to close the gap to the more developed peers in a quick pace.</p> <p>There is a tendency of strong development in Russia and other emerging markets due to structural factors such as large population, increased internet penetration, improved payment solutions and better infrastructure. These e-commerce markets for physical goods is therefore expected to keep growing rapidly.</p>

C.5	Limitations to the free transferability	Not applicable; The Bonds are freely transferable, but the bondholders may be subject to purchase or transfer restrictions with regard to the Bonds, as applicable, under local laws to which a bondholder may be subject.
C.8	Rights pertaining to the Bonds	<p>Interest and repayment: Bondholders are entitled to receive Interest on the Bonds on each Interest Payment Date and repayment of the Nominal Amount together with accrued but unpaid Interest on the Final Redemption Date.</p> <p>Bondholders' meetings: Bondholders representing at least ten (10) per cent. of the Adjusted Nominal Amount are entitled to request a decision of the bondholders. Such decisions are rendered by way of a Holders' Meeting or a Written Procedure, as decided by the Trustee. Valid decisions require the consent of bondholders representing more than fifty (50) per cent. of the Adjusted Nominal Amount for which bondholders are voting, and in respect of certain matters a qualified majority of at least two thirds (2/3) of the Adjusted Nominal Amount for which bondholders are voting is required. Quorum exists if the bondholders present represent at least twenty (20) per cent. of the Adjusted Nominal Amount.</p> <p>Status: The Bonds constitute direct, general, unconditional, unsubordinated and unsecured obligations of the Issuer and shall at all times rank at least <i>pari passu</i> with all direct, general, unconditional, unsubordinated and unsecured obligations of the Issuer, except those obligations which are mandatorily preferred by law, and without any preference among them.</p> <p>No action: No bondholder may take any individual action against the Issuer in matters relating to the Bonds or the Terms and Conditions.</p> <p>Prescription: The right to receive repayment of the Nominal Amount shall be time-barred and become void ten (10) years from the relevant Redemption Date. The right to receive payment of Interest shall be time-barred and become void three (3) years from the relevant due date for payment.</p>
C.9	Summary of the Bonds relating to interest, amortisation, final redemption date etc.	<p>Interest payments: The Bonds bear Interest from, but excluding, the Issue Date up to and including the relevant Redemption Date. Any Subsequent Bond will carry Interest from, but excluding, the Interest Payment Date falling immediately prior to their issuance up to and including the relevant Redemption Date. The Interest Rate is a fixed rate of 6.15 per cent. <i>per annum</i>, payable quarterly in arrears on 14 March, 14 June, 14 September and 14 December each year or, to the extent such day is not a Business Day, the first following day that is a Business Day. The last interest payment is due on the Final Redemption Date. Interest shall be calculated on the basis of a 360-day year comprised of twelve (12) months of thirty (30) days each and, in case of incomplete months, the actual number of days elapsed (30/360-days basis).</p> <p>Final redemption: The Final Redemption Date is 14 June 2022 at which date the Issuer shall redeem all outstanding Bonds at the Nominal Amount together with accrued but unpaid Interest.</p> <p>Early redemption (call option): Provided that the Outstanding Bond has been or shall be redeemed in full, the Issuer may redeem all, but not only some, of the Bonds in full on any Business Day before the Final Redemption Date, at the applicable Call Option Amount together with accrued but unpaid Interest. The Issuer shall give at least fifteen (15) Business Days' notice of such redemption.</p> <p>Mandatory repurchase (put option): Upon a Change of Control Event or a De-Listing Event occurring, each bondholder has, during a period of thirty (30) days, the right to request that all, or only some, of its Bonds are repurchased at a price per Bond equal to 101 per cent. of the Nominal Amount together with accrued but unpaid Interest.</p> <p>Trustee: Nordic Trustee & Agency AB (publ) is acting as trustee for the bondholders in relation to the Bonds, and, if relevant, any other matter within its authority or duty in accordance with the Terms and Conditions.</p>
C.10	Information on the use of derivatives as determination of interest	Not applicable; the calculation of the interest of the Bonds does not depend on derivative instruments.
C.11	Regulated market	The Issuer intends to list the Bonds on the Corporate Bond List at Nasdaq Stockholm.

Section D – Risk factors

D.2	Risks relating to the Issuer	<i>The operations of the Group and the sectors in which it operates are subject to a number of risks that are completely or partly outside the Company's control and which could materially adversely impact the Company's business, financial condition and results of operations and prospects. The risk factors described below are a summary of the main risk factors that the Company considers to be key risks to its business, financial conditions and results of operations.</i>
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	<p>Price risks: The private equity investments held by the Issuer are accounted for at fair value through profit and loss. This implies a share price risk as a decrease in the value of unquoted shares would affect post-tax profit and equity and may have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.</p> <p>Credit risk: Within the Group's portfolio investments operations, credit risk arises from non-current and current loan receivables. The Group is also exposed to counterparty credit risk on cash and cash equivalents and deposits with banks and financial institutions. If a counterparty does not meet its obligations to the Group, it could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.</p> <p>Tax risks: There is a risk that the Issuer's interpretation of applicable rules and administrative practice is incorrect, or that rules or practice will be changed. The Company has previously been subject to a tax audit where the outcome, on appeal, imposed an obligation to pay additional tax. If any of the described risks were to materialise, it could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.</p> <p>Exchange rate risk: The Group is exposed to foreign exchange risk arising from various currency exposures that affect the value of investments. The Issuer's accounts are prepared in USD, and fluctuations in exchange rates may affect the value of the portfolio in ways that do not reflect real economic changes in the underlying assets, which in turn could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.</p> <p>Acquisition and disposal risks: When selling its participations and portfolio investments, the Issuer is exposed to the risk of receiving less than the potential value of the participations and the sum invested, which could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.</p> <p>Risks related to competition: There is a risk that the Issuer will be subject to increased competition, depriving the Issuer of opportunities for beneficial acquisitions or that the Issuer, in the event that such opportunities arose, would not have sufficient resources to carry out such acquisitions. If any of such risks were to materialise, it could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.</p> <p>Legal disputes: The Group may in the future be involved in disputes or be subject to claims that could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.</p> <p>Dependence on key individuals: The Issuer is dependent on its senior executives and its ability to attract, retain and motivate appropriate managerial personnel. There is a risk that the Group might be seriously affected if any of the senior executives were to leave the Company, which could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.</p> <p>International capital flows: The Issuer's share price may be adversely affected due to economic unrest in a growth markets. If foreign investments are inhibited this would have a negative impact on the country's economy, which could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.</p> <p>Liquidity risk: Failure to meet its payment obligations could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position</p> <p>The global capital markets and the economy in general: The Group's results of operations are materially affected by conditions in the global capital markets and the economy in general. An economic downturn could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.</p> <p>Dependency on portfolio companies: The Issuer is dependent upon receipt of sufficient income related to the operation of and the ownership in subsidiaries and affiliated entities to meet its own obligations. A decrease in income from such entities may have a negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.</p> <p>Emerging markets and country-specific risks: An investment in the Bonds will be subject to risks associated with ownership and management of investments and in particular to risks of ownership and management in Russia and other emerging markets. Investment activity in Russia and other emerging markets entails a high level of risk related to e.g. unstable state administration, which are usually not associated with investments in better regulated countries. 2 Risk factors

Investing in the Bonds involves inherent risks. The financial performance of the Issuer and the Group and the risks associated with its business are important when making a decision on whether to invest in the Bonds. A number of risk factors and uncertainties may adversely affect the Group. If any of these risks or uncertainties actually occurs, the business, operating results and financial position of the Group could be materially and adversely affected, which ultimately could affect the Issuer's ability to make payments of interest and repayments of principal under the Terms and Conditions. In this section, a number of risk factors are illustrated, namely general risks pertaining to the Group's business operations and material risks relating to the Bonds as financial instruments. The risks presented below are not exhaustive and other risks not discussed herein may also adversely affect the Group, the price of the Bonds and the Issuer's ability to service its debt obligations. Further, the risk factors are not ranked in order of importance. Potential investors should consider carefully the information contained in this Prospectus and make an independent evaluation before making an investment decision.

Risk related to the Group, the industry and the market

Price risks

The Issuer is exposed to share price risk because of private equity investments held by the Issuer and classified on the consolidated balance sheet as financial assets at fair value through profit and loss. A decrease in the value of unquoted shares would affect post-tax profit and equity and may have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.

Credit risk

Credit risk is the risk that one party to a financial instrument will cause a loss for the other party by failing to pay for its obligation. Within the Group's portfolio investments operations, credit risk arises from non-current and current loan receivables. For the investments in loan receivables, there are no formal restrictions with respect to the counterparty's credit rating. The Group is also exposed to counterparty credit risk on cash and cash equivalents and deposits with banks and financial institutions. If a counterparty is unable or unwilling to meet its obligations to the Group, it could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.

Tax risks

The Issuer conducts its business, including intra-Group transactions, in accordance with the Issuer's interpretation of current tax legislation in relevant jurisdictions, tax treaties and tax authorities' guidelines and other requirements. There is a risk that the Issuer's interpretation of applicable rules and administrative practice is incorrect, or that rules or practice will be changed, potentially with retroactive effect. For example, the Swedish Tax Agency (the "STA") has during 2015 audited Vostok New Ventures AB's VAT returns for the period January 2013 – December 2014. According to the STA's decision from the audit, Vostok New Ventures AB is obliged to pay an additional amount of output VAT of SEK 13,767,907 together with tax penalties of SEK 2,753,579 on the services supplied to the Issuer. Vostok New Venture AB has appealed the STA's decision to the administrative court. On 1 June 2017, the County Administrative Court in Stockholm issued its ruling in favour of the STA's decision. Vostok New Ventures AB has paid an additional VAT for 2013–2014 according to STA's claim and appealed the ruling to the Court of Appeal. The Court of Appeal issued a negative ruling on 28 June 2018 which the Company is going to appeal to the Supreme Administrative Court shortly but latest by 28 Aug 2018. There is a risk that the Group will have to pay additional tax also for other years. If any of the above described risks were to materialise, it could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.

Exchange rate risk

The Group operates internationally and is exposed to foreign exchange risk arising from various currency exposures, mainly with respect to the SEK, RUB, GBP and EUR. The official exchange rates for these and other operational currencies therefore directly or indirectly affect the value of investments, but it is not possible to

quantify this effect as companies have differing foreign exchange sensitivity. The Issuer's accounts are prepared in USD as this is the functional currency. In sum, this means that fluctuations in exchange rates may affect the net asset value of the portfolio in various ways that do not necessarily reflect real economic changes in the underlying assets. Fluctuations in the exchange rates could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.

Acquisition and disposal risks

Acquisitions and disposals are by definition a natural element of the Group's operations. All acquisitions and disposals are subject to uncertainty. The Issuer's explicit exit strategy is to sell its holdings to strategic investors or via the market. There is a risk that the Issuer will not succeed in selling its participations and portfolio investments at the price the shares are being traded at on the market or valued at in the balance sheet at the time of the disposal. The Issuer may therefore fail to sell its holdings in a portfolio company or may have to do so at less than its expected value or even at a loss. If the Issuer disposes of the whole or parts of an investment in a portfolio company, the Issuer may receive less than the potential value of the participations, and the Issuer may receive less than the sum invested, which could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.

Risks related to competition

The Issuer operates in markets that may be subject to increased competition with regard to investment opportunities. A greater number of investors than previously may thus compete with the Issuer in the future for the type of investments that the Issuer intends to make. There is a risk that the Issuer will, in the future, be subject to competition, which might have a detrimental impact on the Issuer's return from investments. There is a risk that opportunities for beneficial acquisitions will not arise or that the Issuer, in the event that such opportunities for acquisition arose, would not have sufficient resources to carry out such acquisitions. If any of the above described risks were to materialise, it could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.

Legal disputes

The Group may in the future be involved in disputes or be subject to claims. Such disputes could be time consuming and result in costs, the size of which cannot always be foreseen. Disputes could, therefore, have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.

Dependence on key individuals

The Issuer is dependent on its senior executives. Its managing director, Per Brilioth, is of particular significance to the development of the Issuer. The Group's success is also dependent on its ability to attract, retain and motivate appropriate managerial personnel within the Group. There is a risk that the Group might be seriously affected if any of the senior executives were to leave the Company. If any of the above described risks were to materialise, it could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.

International capital flows

Economic unrest in a growth market tends to have an adverse impact on the equity markets in other growth countries, or on the share price of companies operating in such countries, as investors opt to re-allocate their investment flows to more stable and developed markets. The Issuer's share price may be adversely affected during such periods. Financial problems or an increase in perceived risk related to a growth market may inhibit foreign investment in such market and have a negative impact on the country's economy. Such an economic downturn could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.

Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Group cannot meet its payment obligations at the maturity date without the cost for obtaining cash or cash equivalents increasing significantly. If the Group's liquidity sources prove not to be

sufficient, there is a risk that the Group can only meet its payment obligations by raising funds on terms significantly increasing its financing costs or that the Group cannot meet its payment obligations at all and as a result thereof being in default under material agreements entered into by the Group, which could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position

The global capital markets and the economy in general

The Group's results of operations are materially affected by conditions in the global capital markets and the economy in general. Concerns over inflation, energy costs, geopolitical issues and the availability and cost of credit have in recent years contributed to increased volatility and negative sentiment on global capital markets. These factors, along with volatile oil prices, declining business and consumer confidence and increased unemployment, have precipitated an economic slowdown and recession from which many countries are yet to recover. In addition, fixed income markets have historically experienced significant volatility which at times has negatively affected market liquidity conditions. Securities that are less liquid are more difficult to value and may be hard to dispose of. Domestic and international equity markets have also been experiencing increased volatility and turmoil. The Group is exposed to substantial risk of loss due to market volatility. Factors such as consumer spending, business investment, government spending, the volatility and strength of the capital markets, and inflation all affect the business and economic environment and, ultimately, the amount and profitability of the Group's business. An economic downturn characterised by higher unemployment, lower family income, lower corporate earnings, lower business investment and lower consumer spending, could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.

Dependency on portfolio companies

The Issuer is a holding company that conducts its operations through subsidiaries and affiliated entities. The Issuer holds few significant assets other than direct and indirect investments in its operating companies. Accordingly, the Issuer is dependent upon receipt of sufficient income related to the operation of and the ownership in such entities to meet its own obligations. The Issuer's ability to benefit from the distribution of any assets of its subsidiaries upon liquidation of any such companies will be subject to the prior claims of such companies' creditors, including trade creditors. A decrease in income from subsidiaries may have a negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.

Emerging markets and country-specific risks

An investment in the Bonds will be subject to risks associated with ownership and management of investments and in particular to risks of ownership and management in Russia and other emerging markets. As these countries are still, from an economic point of view, in a phase of development, investments are affected by unusually large fluctuations in profit and loss and other factors outside the Issuer's control that may have an adverse impact on the value of the Issuer's adjusted equity. Investors should therefore be aware that investment activity in Russia and other emerging markets entails a high level of risk and requires special consideration of factors, including those mentioned here, which are usually not associated with investment in shares in better regulated countries. Unstable state administration could have an adverse impact on investments. None of the emerging markets has a fully developed legal system comparable to that in more developed countries. In these judicial systems existing laws and regulations are sometimes applied inconsistently and both the independence and efficiency of the court system constitutes a significant risk. Statutory changes have taken place and will probably continue to take place at a rapid pace, and it remains difficult to predict the effect of legislative changes and legislative decisions for companies. It could be more difficult to obtain redress or exercise one's rights in emerging markets than in more mature legal systems. If any of the above described risks were to materialise, or if any of the above described factors would have a negative development, it could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.

Exposure to Russia

A significant part of the Group's assets is related to Russia. Russia has undergone deep political and social change in recent years. The value of the Issuer's assets may be affected by uncertainties such as political and diplomatic

developments, social or religious instability, changes in government policy, tax and interest rates, restrictions on the political and economic development of laws and regulations in Russia, major policy changes or lack of internal consensus between leaders, executive and decision-making bodies and strong economic groups. These risks entail in particular expropriation, nationalisation, confiscation of assets and legislative changes relating to the level of foreign ownership. In addition, political changes may be less predictable in a growth country such as Russia than in other more developed countries. Such instability may in some cases have an adverse impact on the Group's operations.

Since the collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991, the Russian economy has, from time to time, shown: significant decline in GDP; weak banking system with limited supply of liquidity to foreign companies; growing black and grey economic markets; high flight of capital; high level of corruption and increased organised economic crime; hyperinflation; and significant rise in unemployment.

Moreover, the Russian economy is largely dependent on the production and export of oil and natural gas, which makes it vulnerable to fluctuations in the oil and gas market. If any of the above described risks were to materialise, or if any of the above described factors would have a negative development, it could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.

Domestic political conflicts and the risk of terrorism

Any terrorist attacks and the resulting heightened security measures in any of the markets where the Company's portfolio companies are active could cause disruptions to domestic commerce in such market and could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.

Accounting practice and access to other information

Practice in accounting, financial reporting and auditing in emerging markets cannot be compared with the corresponding practices that exist in the Western world. This is principally due to the fact that accounting and reporting have only been a function of adaptation to tax legislation. The tradition of not publishing information unnecessarily is still evident. The formal requirements are less broad in terms of publishing information than in more developed markets. In addition, there is a risk that access to external analysis, reliable statistics and historical data is inadequate. The effects of inflation can, moreover, be difficult for external observers to analyse. There is a risk with regard to the completeness or dependability of prepared accounts and auditing. Inadequate information and weak accounting standards could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.

Corporate governance risk

Misuse of corporate governance remains a problem in Russia and other emerging markets. Minority shareholders may be badly treated in various ways, for instance in the sale of assets, transfer pricing, dilution, limited access to annual general meetings and restrictions on seats on boards of directors for external investors. In addition, sales of assets to and transactions with related parties are common. Transfer pricing is generally applied by companies for the transfer of value from subsidiaries and external investors to various types of holding companies. Companies may neglect to comply with the rules that govern share issues, such as prior notification in sufficient time for the exercise of rights of pre-emption. Prevention of registration of shares is also widespread. Despite the fact that independent authorised registrars have to keep most share registers, some are still in the hands of the company management, which may lead to register manipulation. In such cases, a company's management would be able to take extensive strategic measures without proper consent from shareholders and shareholders ability to exercise their right to express views and take decisions is made considerably more difficult. Inadequate accounting rules and standards have hindered the development of an effective system for uncovering fraud and increasing insight. Shareholders can conceal their ownership by acquiring shares through shell company structures based abroad which are not demonstrably connected to the beneficiary, leading to self-serving transactions, insider deals and conflicts of interest. The role of the financial inspectorate, as the regulator of the equity market to guarantee effective oversight and ensure that fraud is uncovered, is complicated by the lack of judicial and administrative enforcement instruments. Deficiencies in legislation on corporate governance, judicial enforcement and corporate

legislation may lead to hostile takeovers, where the rights of minority shareholders are disregarded or abused, which could have a material negative impact on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.

Risks relating to the Bonds

Credit risks

An investment in the Bonds carries a credit risk relating to the Issuer and the Group. The investor's ability to receive payment under the Terms and Conditions is therefore dependent upon the Issuer's ability to meet its payment obligations, which in turn is largely dependent upon the performance of the Group's operations and its financial position. The Group's operations and financial position are in turn affected by several factors, a number of which have been discussed above.

An increased credit risk may cause the market to charge the Bonds a higher risk premium, which would have an adverse effect on the value of the Bonds. Another aspect of the credit risk is that any deterioration in the financial position of the Issuer may entail a lower credit-worthiness and the possibility for the Issuer to receive financing may be impaired when the Bonds mature.

Refinancing risk

The Issuer may be required to refinance certain or all of its outstanding debt, including the Bonds. The Issuer's ability to successfully refinance its debt obligations is dependent upon the conditions of the capital markets and the Issuer's financial position at such time. The Issuer's access to financing sources may not be available on acceptable terms, or at all. The Issuer's inability to refinance its debt obligations on acceptable terms, or at all, could have a material adverse effect on the Issuer's business, financial position and results of operations and on the bondholders' recovery under the Bonds.

Interest rate risk

The Bonds will bear a fixed interest rate. A holder of a security with a fixed interest rate is exposed to the risk that the price of such security falls as a result of changes in the Market Interest Rate. While the nominal rate of a security with a fixed interest rate is fixed for a specified period, the Market Interest Rate typically changes on a daily basis. As the Market Interest Rate changes, the price of such security is likely to change in the opposite direction. If the Market Interest Rate increases, the price of such security typically falls, until the yield of such security is approximately equal to the Market Interest Rate. Investors should be aware that movements of the Market Interest Rate can adversely affect the price of the Bonds and can lead to losses for the bondholders if they sell the Bonds.

Liquidity risks

The Issuer has undertaken to list the Bonds issued in the Initial Bond Issue on the Corporate Bond List of Nasdaq Stockholm within 60 calendar days after the Issue Date. It is further the Issuer's intention to complete such listing within 30 calendar days after such Issue Date. There is a risk that the Bonds will not be admitted to trading. Further, even if securities, including the Bonds, are admitted to trading on Nasdaq Stockholm, there is not always active trading in the securities, so there is a risk that the market for trading in the Bonds will be illiquid even if the Bonds are listed. This may result in the fact that the bondholders cannot sell their Bonds when desired or at a price level which allows for a profit comparable to similar investments with an active and functioning secondary market. Lack of liquidity in the market may have a negative impact on the market value of the Bonds. Furthermore, the nominal value of the Bonds may not be indicative compared to the market price of the Bonds if they are admitted for trading on Nasdaq Stockholm. It should also be noted that during a given time period it may be difficult or impossible to sell the Bonds (at all or at reasonable terms) due to, for example, severe price fluctuations, close down of the relevant market or trade restrictions imposed on the market.

The market price of the Bonds may be volatile

The market price of the Bonds could be subject to significant fluctuations in response to actual or anticipated variations in the Group's operating results and those of its competitors, adverse business developments, changes to the regulatory environment in which the Group operates, changes in financial estimates by securities analysts and the actual or expected sale of a large number of Bonds, as well as other factors. In addition, in recent years the global financial markets have experienced significant price and volume fluctuations, which, if repeated in the future, could adversely affect the market price of the Bonds without regard to the Group's operating results, financial position or prospects.

Unsecured obligations

The Bonds represent unsecured obligations of the Issuer. In the event of the liquidation, bankruptcy, company reorganisation (Sw. *företagsrekonstruktion*) or winding-up of the Issuer, the bondholders normally receive payment after any priority creditors have been paid in full. The bondholders will only have an unsecured claim against the Issuer. As a result, the bondholders may not recover any or all of its investment. Each investor should be aware that by investing in the Bonds, it risks losing all, or a part of, its investment in the event of the Issuer's liquidation, bankruptcy or company reconstruction.

Currency risk

The Bonds will be denominated and payable in SEK. If investors in the Bonds measure their investment return by reference to a currency other than SEK, an investment in the Bonds will entail foreign exchange-related risks due to, among other factors, possible significant changes in the value of the SEK relative to the currency by reference to which investors measure the return on their investments could cause a decrease in the effective yield of the Bonds below their stated coupon rates and could result in a loss to investors when the return on the Bonds is translated into the currency by reference to which the investors measure the return on their investments. Government and monetary authorities may impose (as some have done in the past) exchange controls that could adversely affect an applicable exchange rate or the ability of the Issuer to make payments in respect of the bonds. As a result, there is a risk that investors may receive less interest or principal than expected, or no interest or principal.

Dependence on subsidiaries

A significant part of the Group's assets and revenues relate to the Issuer's subsidiaries. Accordingly, the Issuer is dependent upon receipt of sufficient income related to the operation of and the ownership in the subsidiaries to enable it to make payments under the Bonds. The Issuer's subsidiaries are legally separate and distinct from the Issuer and have no obligation to pay amounts due with respect to the Issuer's obligations and commitments, including the Bonds, or to make funds available for such payments. The ability of the Issuer's subsidiary to make such payments to the Issuer is subject to, among other things, the availability of funds, corporate restrictions and the terms of each operation's indebtedness. Should the Issuer not receive sufficient income from its subsidiaries, the investor's ability to receive payment under the Terms and Conditions may be adversely affected.

Structural subordination and insolvency of subsidiaries

In the event of insolvency, liquidation or a similar event relating to one of the Issuer's subsidiaries, all creditors of such Issuer would be entitled to payment in full out of the assets of such Issuer before any entity within the Group, as a shareholder, would be entitled to any payments. Thus, the Bonds are structurally subordinated to the liabilities of such subsidiaries. There is a risk that the Group and its assets would not be protected from actions by the creditors of any subsidiary of the Group, whether under bankruptcy law, by contract or otherwise. In addition, defaults by, or the insolvency of, certain subsidiaries of the Issuer could result in the obligation of the Issuer to make payments under financial or performance guarantees in respect of such subsidiaries' obligations or the occurrence of cross defaults on certain borrowings of the Group, which could have a material adverse effect on the Issuer's business, financial position and results of operations and on the bondholders' recovery under the Bonds.

Risks related to early redemption and put option

Under the Terms and Conditions, the Issuer has reserved the possibility to redeem all outstanding Bonds before the final redemption date, provided that the Issuer's outstanding bond loan with ISIN SE0010023390 has been redeemed in full. If the Bonds are redeemed within one year after the first issue date, the bondholders have the right to receive an early redemption amount which exceeds the nominal amount of the Bonds. However, there is a risk that the market value of the Bonds is higher than the early redemption amount and that it may not be possible for bondholders to reinvest such proceeds at an effective interest rate as high as the interest rate on the Bonds and may only be able to do so at a significantly lower rate.

According to the Terms and Conditions, the Bonds are subject to prepayment at the option of each bondholder (put option) if (i) an event or series of events occur whereby one or more persons, acting together, acquire control over the Issuer and where "control" means acquiring or controlling, directly or indirectly, more than 50 per cent of the votes of the Issuer, or the right to, directly or indirectly, appoint or remove the whole or a majority of the directors of the Board of Directors of the Issuer or (ii) the Issuer's shares are not listed or admitted to trading on Nasdaq Stockholm or any other regulated market, or if the Issuer's shares on the aforementioned stock exchanges is suspended for a period of 15 consecutive banking days. There is, however, a risk that the Issuer will not have sufficient funds at the time of such prepayment to make the required prepayment of the Bonds which could adversely affect the Issuer, *e.g.*, by causing insolvency or an event of default under the Terms and Conditions, and thus adversely affect all bondholders and not only those that choose to exercise the option.

No action against the Issuer and bondholders' representation

In accordance with the Terms and Conditions, the trustee will represent all bondholders in all matters relating to the Bonds and the bondholders are prevented from taking actions on their own against the Issuer. Consequently, individual bondholders do not have the right to take legal actions to declare any default by claiming any payment from or enforcing any security granted by the Issuer and may therefore lack effective remedies unless and until a requisite majority of the bondholders agree to take such action. However, there is a risk that a bondholder, in certain situations, could bring its own action against the Issuer (in breach of the Terms and Conditions), which could negatively impact an acceleration of the Bonds or other action against the Issuer. To enable the trustee to represent bondholders in court, the bondholders may have to submit a written power of attorney for legal proceedings. The failure of all bondholders to submit such a power of attorney could negatively affect the legal proceedings. Under the Terms and Conditions, the trustee will in some cases have the right to make decisions and take measures that bind all bondholders. Consequently, the actions of the trustee in such matters could impact a bondholder's rights under the Terms and Conditions in a manner that would be undesirable for some of the bondholders.

Bondholders' meetings

The Terms and Conditions will include certain provisions regarding bondholders' meetings. Such meetings may be held in order to resolve on matters relating to the bondholders' interests. The Terms and Conditions will allow for certain majorities to bind all bondholders, including bondholders who have not taken part in the meeting and those who have voted differently to the required majority at a duly convened and conducted bondholders' meeting. Consequently, the actions of the majority in such matters could impact a bondholder's rights in a manner that would be undesirable for some of the bondholders.

Ability to comply with the Terms and Conditions

The Group is required to comply with the Terms and Conditions. Events beyond the Group's control, including changes in the economic and business condition in which the Group operates, may affect the Group's ability to comply with, among other things, the undertakings set out in the Terms and Conditions. A breach of the Terms and Conditions could result in a default under the Terms and Conditions.

Restrictions on the transferability of the Bonds

The Bonds have not been and will not be registered under the U.S. Securities Act of 1933, as amended, or any U.S. state securities laws. Subject to certain exemptions, a holder of the Bonds may not offer or sell the Bonds in the United States. The Issuer has not undertaken to register the Bonds under the U.S. Securities Act or any U.S. state securities laws or to affect any exchange offer for the Bonds in the future. Furthermore, the Issuer has not registered the Bonds under any other country's securities laws. Each potential investor should observe and obey the transfer restrictions that apply to the Bonds. It is the bondholder's obligation to ensure, at own cost and expense, that its offers and sales of Bonds comply with all applicable securities laws. Due to these restrictions, there is a risk that a bondholder cannot sell its Bonds as desired.

Risks relating to the clearing and settlement in Euroclear's book-entry system

The Bonds will be affiliated to Euroclear's account-based system, and no physical Bonds will be issued. Clearing and settlement relating to the Bonds will be carried out within Euroclear's book-entry system as well as payment of interest and repayment of the principal. Investors are therefore dependent upon the functionality of Euroclear's account-based system, which is a factor that the Issuer cannot control. If Euroclear's account-based system would not function properly, there is a risk that investors would not receive payments under the Bonds as they fall due.

Amended or new legislation

The Terms and Conditions are based on Swedish law in force at the Issue Date. The impact of any possible future Swedish legislative measures or changes, or changes to Swedish administrative practices, such as new or amended tax legislation, may give rise to risks which are not possible to foresee. There is a risk that amended or new Swedish legislation and administrative practices, such as new or amended tax legislation, may adversely affect the investor's ability to receive payment under the Terms and Conditions.

Conflicts of interest

The Issuing Agent and Sole Bookrunner have engaged in, and may in the future engage in, investment banking and/or commercial banking or other services for the Issuer and the Group in the ordinary course of business. The Issuing Agent and Sole Bookrunner may thus in the future have relations with the Group other than those arising from its role in the issue of the Bonds. The Issuing Agent and Sole Bookrunner may, for example, provide services related to financing other than through the issue of the Bonds, such as investment banking services for, or other commercial dealings with, the Group. Therefore, conflict of interest may exist or may arise as a result of the Issuing Agent and Sole Bookrunner having previously engaged, or will in the future engage, in transactions with other parties, having multiple roles or carrying out other transactions for third parties with conflicting interests. Such conflicts of interest could adversely affect the Group's ability to renew or maintain existing financing or obtain further financing and in turn have a material negative effect on the Group's operations, earnings and financial position.

3 Statement of responsibility

The Company issued the Bonds on 14 June 2018. This Prospectus has been prepared in relation to the Company applying for admission to trading of the Bonds on Nasdaq Stockholm, in accordance with the Commission Regulation (EC) No 809/2004 of 29 April 2004 implementing Directive 2003/71/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council and the rules and regulations in Chapter 2 of the Swedish Financial Instruments Trading Act, each as amended.

5 The Group and its operations

Introduction

The Company is an exempted company limited by shares registered in Bermuda with registration number 39861, having its registered address at Clarendon House, 2 Church Street, Hamilton HM 11, Bermuda. The Company was formed on 4 April 2007 and registered with the Bermudan Registrar of Companies on 5 April 2007. The Company is governed by Bermudan law and uses the trading name Vostok New Ventures.

Governance

To ensure that the control over the Company is not abused, the Company complies with the Bermuda Companies Act 1981 (the “**Bermuda Companies Act**”). The conduct of the Company is governed not only by the Bermuda Companies Act, but also by the Company’s memorandum of association and bye-laws and by Bermuda common law. Since the Company’s depository receipts are listed on a Swedish regulated market, it applies the Swedish Corporate Governance Code (Sw. *Svensk kod för bolagsstyrning*) (the “**Code**”). The Company will apply the Code to the extent it is compliant with the Bermuda Companies Act, or, where applicable, explain deviations from it. At present, the Company deviates from the Code in that it does not have an internal audit function and that the Board of Directors does not yet have a designated Audit Committee. Until an Audit Committee is appointed, the Board of Directors in its entirety remains responsible for reviewing the financial reports issued by the Company, including the four quarterly reports as well as the annual report, and for addressing any critical accounting issues.

Business and operations

Vostok New Ventures is an investment company with the business concept of using experience, expertise and a widespread network to identify and invest in assets with considerable potential for value appreciation, with a focus on companies with network effects. Vostok New Ventures intends to create value through professional investing activities, building on a structured process for continuous analysis of both current and prospective acquisitions.

The Company’s aim is to undertake investments that the Company’s shareholders have limited ability or are unable to pursue themselves. This implies managing risks associated with low transparency and weak corporate governance as well as illiquidity. An active investment philosophy is deemed necessary to achieve the appropriate level of risk in relation to the return potential.

The foundation for the investment activities is fundamental analysis of primarily unlisted companies. In markets and sectors where Vostok New Ventures has particular knowledge and expertise, such as in Russia and online classifieds, the return requirement may sometimes be lower while in sectors where the Company do not have the same experience of investing, the requirement may be higher. The latter is intended to compensate for an increased amount of risk.

The Company’s sector mandate is broad and the proposition is to create shareholder value by investing in assets that are associated with risks which Vostok New Ventures is well-equipped to manage. Such typical risks include corporate governance risks, liquidity risks and operational risks. During the past years, Vostok New Ventures has gained experience and built an extensive network enabling it to handle the risks associated with investments in emerging markets.

One way of managing corporate governance risks in the portfolio companies is to pursue an active ownership policy. Active ownership is important in all markets, but especially in emerging markets where corporate governance risks can take on additional dimensions to that of more developed markets. Over the years, Vostok New Ventures has built up a considerable ability for implementing an active ownership in emerging markets. This can take many different forms, of which board representation is one.

The Company's investment strategy is to run investments into primarily equity holdings in private companies with a high return potential. The key short-term objective of Vostok New Ventures is to deploy investor funds into an attractive portfolio of fast growth online marketplace companies. The key long-term objective of Vostok New Ventures is to create value through its portfolio of companies. Vostok New Ventures seeks to generate above average returns for its shareholders by investing in modern online marketplaces companies that exhibit network effects and potential for value appreciation. To achieve these goals the Company often takes an active role at the board level and eventually exits from the position with profit.

Investments

Since the Company's consolidated interim report for the financial period 1 January – 31 March 2018, Vostok New Ventures has invested USD 1.5 million in a new funding round including primary and secondary shares in El Basharsoft. The previously announced USD 1 million investment in El Basharsoft through a convertible note was converted to equity in connection with this round.

As investments are an integral part of the Company's operations, there will always be ongoing discussions about potential investments in the ordinary course of the Group's activities. Except from the investment made in El Basharsoft, the Company does not have any material ongoing or scheduled investments. The Company's investments are generally financed through bond proceeds, dividends from Avito and/or available cash.

Board committees

Given the central role that valuation of unlisted holdings plays in the Company's accounts, the Board of Directors has hitherto taken the view that all board members need to be informed and involved in the Company's reporting. For this reason, the Board has not formed an Audit Committee, and the Board of Directors currently has no other sub-committees. However, at the annual general meeting held on 16 May 2018, the shareholders of the Company resolved to approve remuneration to members of an Audit Committee and a Remuneration Committee in accordance with the proposal of the Nomination Committee. As of the date of this Prospectus, neither an Audit Committee nor a Remuneration Committee has been constituted.

Nomination Committee

Shareholders in the Company have the right to nominate members of the Board of Directors and auditors to the annual general meeting. The Nomination Committee consists of representatives of the three largest shareholders

of the Company. The Nomination Committee currently consist of the following members: Jake Hennemuth, appointed by Ruane Cunniff & Goldfarb, Jonathan Green, appointed by Luxor Capital and Evert Carlsson, appointed by Swedbank Robur Funds, as well as the chairman of the Board of Directors Lars O Grönstedt. The Nomination Committee's task is to prepare proposals for resolutions at the annual general meeting regarding appointment of chairman at the annual general meeting, appointment of board members and chairman of the Board of Directors, remuneration of the directors, election and remuneration of auditors and proposals on the nomination process for the following annual general meeting. In proposing board members for election at the annual general meeting, the Nomination Committee applies section 4 of the Code, which contains provisions regarding diversity and breadth of qualifications, experience and background, gender equality, and the directors' independence of the company, its executive management and major shareholders.

Conflicts of interests

None of the members of the Board of Directors or the senior management of the Company has a private interest that may be in conflict with the interests of the Company. However, Colle Capital, a technology venture fund managed by Victoria Grace, is a shareholder in BlaBlaCar alongside the Company. Although there are currently no conflicts of interest, it cannot be excluded that conflicts of interest may come to arise between companies in which members of the Board of Directors and members of the senior management have duties, as described above, and the Company.

Auditor

PricewaterhouseCoopers AB has been the Company's auditor since 2007, (i.e. for the period covered by the historical financial information incorporated into this Prospectus by reference). From 2012 and onwards, Ulrika Ramsvik has been the auditor-in-charge and, from 2014, Bo Hjalmarsson the co-signing auditor. Ulrika Ramsvik and Bo Hjalmarsson are members of FAR. Unless otherwise explicitly stated, no information contained in this Prospectus has been audited or reviewed by the Company's auditors.

Financial interests

Several members of the Board of Directors and the senior management have a financial interest in the Company through their direct and indirect holdings of shares in the Company.


Dependence on subsidiaries and associated companies

A significant part of the Group's assets and revenues relate to the Company's subsidiaries and associated companies. Accordingly, the Company's operating results and financial position is dependent upon receipt of income related to the operation of and the ownership in such entities.

8 Legal considerations and supplementary information

Legal group structure

The Company is currently the parent company of three subsidiaries; in Cyprus, the Netherlands and Sweden. The Group structure is illustrated in the figure below. The Company is the parent company and acts as the holding company of the Group and therefore owns, manages and finances its holdings through its wholly-owned Cypriot subsidiary, Vostok New Ventures (Cyprus) Limited. Vostok New Ventures (Cyprus) Limited is responsible for the Group's portfolio (in some cases via Vostok Co-Investment Coöperatief B.A). Vostok Co-Investment Coöperatief B.A and Vostok New Ventures AB are both subsidiaries of Vostok New Ventures (Cyprus) Limited. Vostok New Ventures AB provides mainly business support services to the Company.



Share capital, shares and major shareholders

The Company's current share capital amounts to USD 27,420,258.88 divided among 85,688,309 shares with a par value of USD 0.32 each. Given that the authorised maximum share capital of the Company is USD 110 million and the par value of each share USD 0.32, the maximum amount of shares in the Company is 343,750,000. The Company's outstanding shares are represented by SDRs which are issued under Swedish law, freely transferable, registered with Euroclear Sweden and traded on Nasdaq Stockholm. One SDR carries the same right to dividend as one underlying share, and SDR holders have the same voting rights at the General Meetings as holders of shares. Each SDR entitles the holder to one (1) vote.

All of the outstanding shares are fully paid, issued in accordance with Bermuda law and denominated in USD. As at 31 May 2018, the ten largest shareholders of the Company were: Ruane, Cunniff & Goldfarb Inc. with 16,635,418 shares (19.7 per cent. of total shares), Swedbank Robur Funds with 8,250,718 shares (9.8 per cent. of total shares), Aleccta Pension Insurance with 6,930,000 shares (8.2 per cent. of total shares), T. Rowe Price with 4,669,070 shares (5.5 per cent. of total shares), Fidelity Funds with 4,349,396 shares (5.1 per cent. of total shares), Second Swedish National Pension Fund with 4,276,599 shares (5.1 per cent. of total shares), Armor

Advisors LLC with 3,567,000 shares (4.2 per cent. of total shares), Kayne Anderson Rudnick Investment Management with 2,680,183 shares (3.2 per cent. of total shares), Catella Funds with 1,926,916 shares (2.3 per cent. of total shares) and Protector Forsikring ASA with 1,440,000 (1.7 per cent. of total shares). To ensure that the control over the Company is not abused, the Company complies with the Bermuda Companies Act and with the Code as described in section “*Governance*”. In addition, the Company acts in accordance with the rules of procedure of the board of directors and the instructions for the managing director adopted by the Company.

Material agreements of the Group etc.

The Company has not entered into any material agreements, or agreements under which any member of the Group has any obligation or entitlement which is material to the Group, besides agreements entered into in the ordinary course of business.

Disputes

The Company is not, and has not been, party to any legal or arbitration proceedings during the last 12 months which may have, or have had, significant effects on the Company’s or the Group’s financial condition or profitability. However, the Company is from time to time involved in legal proceedings in the ordinary course of business.

Documents available for inspection

The Company’s (i) by-laws, (ii) memorandum of association, (iii) consolidated annual reports for the financial years 2016 and 2017, including the auditor’s reports for the financial years 2016 and 2017 for the Company and, where such annual reports have been prepared, for the Company’s subsidiaries and (iv) consolidated unaudited interim report for the period 1 January –31 March 2018, for the Company and other published information referred to in this prospectus are available in hard copies for inspection during office hours at the Company’s head office at Clarendon House, 2 Church Street, Hamilton HM 11, Bermuda.

Significant adverse changes and recent events

There has been no material adverse change in the prospects of the Company since the date of publication of its last audited financial report and no significant change in the financial or market position of the Group since the end of the last financial period for which financial information has been published.

Tendencies

Apart from the following tendencies, which based on the Company’s opinion, the Company is not aware of any tendencies that, directly or indirectly, has materially affected or materially would affect the Company’s operations.

As an increasing number of people have gained access to the internet, the marketplaces have migrated from the local marketplace to the internet. Consequently, the line between local and global has started to dissolve, and buyers and sellers are today only a click away from each other, despite long geographical distances.

In developed countries with a high level of internet penetration, the migration to online marketplaces has reached a high maturity with several multi-billion dollar companies such as eBay, Amazon and Airbnb. In many emerging markets the level of internet penetration lags far behind that of the more developed countries. While the internet penetration in these regions is still low, for example in the area surrounding the Middle East and North Africa and CIS region, it has increased rapidly and is expected to close the gap to the more developed peers in a quick pace.

There is a tendency of strong development in Russia and other emerging markets due to structural factors such as large population, increased internet penetration, improved payment solutions and better infrastructure. These e-commerce markets for physical goods is therefore expected to keep growing rapidly.

Credit rating

Neither the Company nor the Bonds have a credit rating from an international credit rating institute.

Shareholders' agreements etc.

As far as the Company is aware, there are no shareholders' agreements or other agreements which could result in a change of control of the Company.

9 Certain tax issues in Sweden

The following is a summary of certain tax issues that may arise as a result of acquiring, holding and selling the Bonds. The summary is based on Swedish tax legislation in force at the date of this prospectus. The summary does not cover all possible tax issues that may arise and is intended only as general information. As an example this summary does not cover any reporting requirements for a party paying interest. The summary also does not cover Bonds held by partnerships (Sw. handelsbolag) or defined as a current asset in a business activity. Furthermore this summary does not cover holdings on investment savings accounts (Sw. investerings-sparkonton) which are subject to a standardized taxation. Certain tax rules also apply to certain investors, such as investment companies and insurance companies. The taxation of each investor depends on the specifics of such investor. Every investor in the Bonds should consult tax advisers in order to receive information on the specific tax issues in relation to its particular case, including the application and effects of foreign or other rules and tax treaties.

Holders of Bonds which are non-resident in Sweden

With bondholders which are non-resident in Sweden is meant (a) a natural person who is not tax resident in Sweden and has no other connection to Sweden apart from his or hers investment in the Bonds, or (b) a company which is not registered in Sweden or, if no registration has been made, which is not due to any other circumstance to be considered as a Swedish legal person.

Repayments and payments of interest to a bondholder which is non-resident in Sweden is not subject to Swedish income tax provided the bondholder is not engaged in any business conducted from a permanent establishment in Sweden to which the holding of Bonds relates.

Swedish withholding tax is not applicable to repayments or payment of interest to bondholders which are non-resident in Sweden.

Capital gains which may occur when a bondholder which is non-resident in Sweden divests Bonds are not subject to Swedish capital gains tax provided the bondholder is not engaged in any business conducted from a permanent establishment in Sweden to which the holding of Bonds relates.

In accordance with a specific tax rule natural persons who are not tax resident in Sweden may be subject to Swedish capital gains tax when divesting certain financial instruments, subject to the classification of the instrument, if the person at any time during the calendar year in which the divestment occurs or during any of the ten years prior to the divestment has been resident or lived permanently in Sweden. The applicability of this rule may however be limited by an applicable tax treaty between Sweden and other countries.

Holders of Bonds which are resident in Sweden

With Holders which are resident in Sweden is meant (a) a natural person who is tax resident in Sweden, or (b) a company which is registered in Sweden or, if no registration has been made, which is due to any other circumstance to be considered as a Swedish legal person.

Payment of interest to bondholders resident in Sweden is generally subject to Swedish income tax. Bondholders resident in Sweden are also subject to Swedish income tax on capital gains in connection with any divestment of the Bonds. Early redemption or repayment of Bonds are tax wise treated as a divestment. Redemption of the nominal value of the Bonds is not subject to Swedish income tax.

Swedish withholding tax is not applicable to repayment or payment of interest to bondholders resident in Sweden. On any payment of interest to bondholders resident in Sweden who are natural persons (or estates of a deceased person) a preliminary tax of 30 percent is withheld. The preliminary tax is normally withheld by

Euroclear Sweden or, in the case of nominee bondholders (Sw. *förvaltarregistrerade obligationer*), by the nominee.

1. DEFINITIONS AND CONSTRUCTION

1.1 Definitions

In these terms and conditions (the “**Terms and Conditions**”):

“**Account Operator**” means a bank or other party duly authorised to operate as an account operator pursuant to the Central Securities Depositories and Financial Instruments Accounts Act and through which a Holder has opened a Securities Account in respect of its Bonds.

“**Accounting Principles**” means the international financial reporting standards (IFRS) within the meaning of Regulation 1606/2002/EC (or as otherwise adopted or amended from time to time).

“**Adjusted Nominal Amount**” means the total aggregate Nominal Amount of the Bonds outstanding at the relevant time less the Nominal Amount of all Bonds owned by the Issuer, a Group Company or an Affiliate of the Issuer or a Group Company, irrespective of whether such Person is directly registered as owner of such Bonds.

“**Advance Purchase Agreement**” means (a) an advance or deferred purchase agreement if the agreement is in respect of the supply of assets or services and payment in the normal course of business with credit periods which are normal for the relevant type of project contracts, or (b) any other trade credit incurred or provided in the ordinary course of business.

“**Affiliate**” means any Person, directly or indirectly, controlling or controlled by or under direct or indirect common control with such specified Person. For the purpose of this definition, “**control**” when used with respect to any Person means the power to direct the management and policies of such Person, directly or indirectly, whether through the ownership of voting securities, by contract or otherwise; and the terms “**controlling**” and “**controlled**” have meanings correlative to the foregoing.

- (b) that the Equity Ratio and the ratio of Net Interest Bearing Debt to Net Asset Value shall be measured on the Testing Date so determined, calculated *pro forma* including any new assets acquired with the proceeds from new Financial Indebtedness and including the new Financial Indebtedness provided it is an interest bearing obligation; and
- (c) that the figures for Total Assets, Equity and Net Asset Value for the Reference Period ending on the last day of the period covered by the most recent Financial Report shall be adjusted:
 - (i) so that any asset acquired or disposed of by the Group during the Reference Period, or after the end of the Reference Period but before the Testing Date, shall be included or excluded (as applicable), *pro forma*, for the entire Reference Period; and
 - (ii) so that any asset to be acquired with the proceeds from new Financial Indebtedness shall be included, *pro forma*, for the entire Reference Period.

“**Call Option Amount**” means:

- (a) one hundred and two (102.00) per cent. of the Nominal Amount if the call option is exercised after the Issue Date up to (but not including) the date falling twelve (12) months after the Issue Date;
- (b) one hundred (100.00) per cent. of the Nominal Amount if the call option is exercised on the date falling twelve (12) months after the Issue Date up to (but not including) the Final Redemption Date.

“**Central Securities Depositories and Financial Instruments Accounts Act**” means the Swedish Central Securities Depositories and Financial Instruments Accounts Act (Sw. *lag (1998:1479) om värdepapperscentraler och kontoföring av finansiella instrument*).

“**Change of Control Event**” means the occurrence of an event or series of events whereby one or more Persons, acting together, acquire control over the Issuer and where “control” means (a) acquiring or controlling, directly or indirectly, more than fifty (50.00) per cent. of the voting shares of the Issuer, or (b) the right to, directly or indirectly, appoint or remove the whole or a majority of the directors of the board of directors of the Issuer.

“**Compliance Certificate**” means a certificate, in form and substance satisfactory to the Trustee, signed by the Issuer certifying that, so far as it is aware, no Event of Default is continuing or, if it is aware that such event is continuing, specifying the event and steps, if any, being taken to remedy it. The Compliance Certificate shall include calculations and figures in respect of the Equity Ratio and the ratio of Net Interest Bearing Debt to Net Asset Value.

“**CSD**” means the Issuer’s central securities depository and registrar in respect of the Bonds from time to time; initially Euroclear Sweden AB (reg. no. 556112-8074, P.O. Box 191, SE-101 23 Stockholm, Sweden).

“**De-listing Event**” means a situation where (i) the Issuer’s shares are not listed and admitted to trading on Nasdaq Stockholm or any other Regulated Market; or (ii) trading of the Issuer’s shares on the aforementioned stock exchanges is suspended for a period of fifteen (15) consecutive Business Days.

“**Equity**” means the aggregate amount which in accordance with the Accounting Principles would be shown in the Issuer’s consolidated Financial Report as the shareholders’ equity of the Group.

“**Equity Ratio**” means the ratio of Equity to Total Assets.

“**Event of Default**” means an event or circumstance specified in Clause 12.1.

“**Final Redemption Date**” means 14 June 2022.

“**Financial Indebtedness**” means any indebtedness in respect of:

- (a) monies borrowed or raised, including Market Loans;
- (b) the amount of any liability in respect of any finance leases, to the extent the arrangement is treated as a finance lease in accordance with the Accounting Principles applicable on the Issue Date (a lease which in the accounts of the Group is treated as an asset and a corresponding liability), and for the avoidance of doubt, any leases treated as operating leases under the Accounting Principles as applicable on the Issue Date shall not, regardless of any subsequent changes or amendments of the Accounting Principles, be considered as finance or capital leases;
- (c) receivables sold or discounted (other than any receivables to the extent they are sold on a non-recourse basis);
- (d) any amount raised under any other transaction (including any forward sale or purchase agreement) having the commercial effect of a borrowing;
- (e) any derivative transaction entered into in connection with protection against or benefit from fluctuation in any rate or price (and, when calculating the value of any derivative transaction, only the mark to market value shall be taken into account, provided that if any actual amount is due as a result of a termination or a close-out, such amount shall be used instead);
- (f) any counter indemnity obligation in respect of a guarantee, indemnity, bond, standby or documentary letter of credit or any other instrument issued by a bank or financial institution; and
- (g) (without double counting) any guarantee or other assurance against financial loss in respect of a type referred to in the above items (a) to (f).

“**Financial Report**” means the Group’s and the Issuer’s annual audited financial statements and quarterly interim unaudited reports, which shall be prepared and made available according to 11.9 (a) and (b).

“**Force Majeure Event**” has the meaning set forth in Clause 24.1.

“**Group**” means the Issuer and all Subsidiaries from time to time and “**Group Company**” means the Issuer or any of the Subsidiaries.

“**Holder**” means the Person who is registered on a Securities Account as direct registered owner (Sw. *ägare*) or nominee (Sw. *förvaltare*) with respect to a Bond.

“**Holders’ Meeting**” means a meeting among the Holders held in accordance with Clause 15 (*Holders’ Meeting*).

“**Incurrence Test**” the Incurrence Test is met if:

- (a) the Equity Ratio exceeds eighty five (85.00) per cent.;
- (b) the ratio of Net Interest Bearing Debt to Net Asset Value is less than ten (10.00) per cent.; and
- (c) no Event of Default is continuing or would result from the incurrence

calculated in accordance with the Calculation Principles.

“**Initial Bond**” means any Bond issued on the Issue Date.

“**Initial Bond Issue**” has the meaning set forth in Clause 2.1.

“**Interest**” means the interest on the Bonds calculated in accordance with Clause 9.1 to 9.3.

“**Interest Payment Date**” means 14 March, 14 June, 14 September and 14 December each year or, to the extent such day is not a Business Day, the Business Day following from an application of the Business Day Convention (with the first Interest Payment Date on 14 September 2018 and the last Interest Payment Date being the Final Redemption Date).

“**Interest Period**” means each period beginning on (but excluding) the Issue Date or any Interest Payment Date and ending on (and including) the next succeeding Interest Payment Date (or a shorter period if relevant) and, in respect of Subsequent Bonds, each period beginning on (but excluding) the Interest Payment Date falling immediately prior to their issuance and ending on (and including) the next succeeding Interest Payment Date (or a shorter period if relevant) in no case adjusted due to an application of the Business Day Convention.

“**Interest Rate**” means the fixed interest of six point fifteen (6.15) per cent. *per annum*.

“**Issuer**” means Vostok New Ventures Ltd (reg. no. 39861, Clarendon House, 2 Church Street, Hamilton HM 11, Bermuda).

“**Issuing Agent**” means Pareto Securities AB (reg. no. 556206-8956, P.O. Box 7415, SE-103 91 Stockholm, Sweden) or another party replacing it, as Issuing Agent, in accordance with these Terms and Conditions.

“**Issue Date**” means 14 June 2018.

“**Maintenance Test**” is met if:

- (a) the Equity Ratio exceeds seventy five (75.00) per cent.; and
- (b) the ratio of Net Interest Bearing Debt to Net Asset Value is less than twenty (20.00) per cent.;

calculated in accordance with paragraph (c) of the Calculation Principles (as applicable).

“**Market Loan**” means any loan or other indebtedness where an entity issues commercial paper, certificates, subordinated debentures, bonds or any other debt securities (including, for the avoidance of doubt, medium term note programmes and other market funding programmes), provided in each case that such instruments and securities are or can be subject to trade on a Regulated Market or recognised unregulated market place.

“**Material Adverse Effect**” means a material adverse effect on (a) the business, financial condition or operations of the Group taken as a whole, (b) the Issuer’s ability to perform and comply with its payment and the undertakings set out in Clause 11 (*Special Undertakings*), or (c) the validity or enforceability of these Terms and Conditions.

“**Material Group Company**” means the Issuer or a Subsidiary representing more than ten (10.00) per cent. of the Total Assets.

“**Nasdaq Stockholm**” means the Regulated Market of Nasdaq Stockholm Aktiebolag (reg. no 556420-8394, SE-105 78 Stockholm, Sweden).

“**Net Asset Value**” means the aggregate market value of the Group’s investment portfolio after deducting Net Interest Bearing Debt and other liabilities of the Group in accordance with the Accounting Principles and as shown in the Issuer’s consolidated Financial Report.

“**Net Interest Bearing Debt**” means the aggregate interest bearing debt (excluding any interest bearing debt borrowed from any Group Company) less cash and cash equivalents of the Group in accordance with the Accounting Principles and as shown in the Issuer’s consolidated Financial Report.

“**Net Proceeds**” means the proceeds from the Initial Bond Issue or any Subsequent Bond Issue after deduction has been made for the Transaction Costs payable by the Issuer to the Sole Bookrunner (if the Sole Bookrunner has requested that their respective fees and costs shall be deducted) and the Issuing Agent for the services provided in relation to the placement and issuance of the Bonds.

“**Nominal Amount**” has the meaning set forth in Clause 2.1.

“**Outstanding Bond**” means the Issuer’s outstanding senior unsecured bond, issued on 22 June 2017 with ISIN SE0010023390.

“**Person**” means any individual, corporation, partnership, limited liability company, joint venture, association, joint-stock company, trust, unincorporated organisation, government, or any agency or political subdivision thereof or any other entity, whether or not having a separate legal personality.

“**Permitted Debt**” means any Financial Indebtedness:

- (a) incurred under (i) the Bonds (including pursuant to any Subsequent Bond Issue, if such incurrence meets the Incurrence Test (calculated *pro forma* including such issue) and (ii) the Outstanding Bond;
- (b) taken up from a Group Company;
- (c) of the Group under any guarantee issued by a Group Company for the obligations of any Group Company, in the ordinary course of business;
- (d) related to any agreements under which a Group Company leases office space (Sw. *kontorshyresavtal*) or other premises provided that such Financial Indebtedness is incurred in the ordinary course of such Group Company's business;
- (e) arising under a foreign exchange transaction or commodity derivatives for spot or forward delivery entered into in connection with protection against fluctuation in currency rates or prices where the exposure arises in the ordinary course of business or in respect of payments to be made under these Terms and Conditions, but not any transaction for investment or speculative purposes;
- (f) arising under any interest rate hedging transactions, but not any transaction for investment or speculative purposes;
- (g) arising under any hedging transactions related to obligations under executive remuneration plans forming part of the ordinary course of business;
- (h) incurred under Advance Purchase Agreements;
- (i) incurred under any counter-indemnity obligation and in the ordinary course of business;
- (j) incurred by the Issuer if such Financial Indebtedness is unsecured and ranks *pari passu* or is subordinated to the obligations of the Issuer under these Terms and Conditions and (i) meets the Incurrence Test on a *pro forma* basis, (ii) has a final maturity date or a final redemption date, and (iii) when applicable, has early redemption dates or instalment dates, in each case (ii) and (iii) which occur after the Final Redemption Date; and
- (k) incurred in connection with the redemption of the Bonds in order to fully refinance the Bonds and provided further that such Financial Indebtedness is subject to an escrow arrangement up until the redemption of the Bonds (taking into account the rules and regulations of the CSD), for the purpose of securing, *inter alia*, the redemption of the Bonds.

“Permitted Security” means any security or guarantee:

- (a) arising by operation of law or in the ordinary course of business (including collateral or retention of title arrangements in connection with Advance Purchase Agreements but, for the avoidance of doubt, not including guarantees or security in respect of any monies borrowed or raised);

- (b) provided in relation to any agreement under which a Group Company leases office space (Sw. *kontorshyresavtal*) or other premises provided that such lease constitutes Permitted Debt;
- (c) arising under any netting or set off arrangements under financial derivatives transactions or bank account arrangements, including group cash pool arrangements;
- (d) provided for foreign exchange transactions or hedging transactions set out in paragraphs (e), (f) and (g) of the definition Permitted Debt;
- (e) provided for any guarantees issued by a Group Company in the ordinary course of business;
- (f) provided in relation to any counter-indemnity obligation and in the ordinary course of business as set out in paragraph (i) in the definition of Permitted Debt; and
- (g) provided in connection with a redemption of the Bonds and/or the Outstanding Bond in full and constituting a first priority pledge over a bank account in the name of the Issuer for the purpose of securing, *inter alia*, the redemption of the Bonds and/or the Outstanding Bond (as applicable).

“**Record Date**” means the fifth (5th) Business Day prior to (a) an Interest Payment Date, (b) a Redemption Date, (c) a date on which a payment to the Holders is to be made under Clause 13 (*Distribution of proceeds*), (d) the date of a Holders’ Meeting, or (e) another relevant date, or in each case such other Business Day falling prior to a relevant date if generally applicable on the Swedish bond market.

“**Redemption Date**” means the date on which the relevant Bonds are to be redeemed or repurchased in accordance with Clause 10 (*Redemption and repurchase of the Bonds*).

“**Reference Date**” means 31 March, 30 June, 30 September and 31 December in each year for as long as any Bonds are outstanding.

“**Reference Period**” means each period of twelve (12) consecutive calendar months.

“**Regulated Market**” means any regulated market (as defined in Directive 2004/39/EC on markets in financial instruments).

“**Restricted Payment**” has the meaning set forth in Clause 11.1.

“**Securities Account**” means the account for dematerialised securities maintained by the CSD pursuant to the Central Securities Depositories and Financial Instruments Accounts Act in which (a) an owner of such security is directly registered or (b) an owner’s holding of securities is registered in the name of a nominee.

“**SEK**” means the lawful currency of Sweden.

“**Sole Bookrunner**” means Pareto Securities AB (reg. no. 556206-8956, P.O. Box 7415, SE-103 91 Stockholm, Sweden).

“**Subsequent Bond Issue**” has the meaning set forth in Clause 2.4.

“**Subsequent Bonds**” means any Bonds issued after the Issue Date on one or more occasions.

“**Subsidiary**” means an entity from time to time of which the Issuer:

- (a) has direct or indirect control; or
- (b) owns directly or indirectly more than fifty (50.00) per cent. of the share capital or other right of ownership.

“**Total Assets**” means the Group’s total assets in accordance with the Accounting Principles and as shown in the Issuer’s consolidated Financial Report.

“**Transaction Costs**” means all fees, costs and expenses, stamp, registration and other taxes incurred by the Issuer or any other member of the Group in connection with (a) the Initial Bond Issue or a Subsequent Bond Issue and (b) the listing of the Bonds.

“**Trustee**” means the Holders’ agent under these Terms and Conditions, from time to time; initially Nordic Trustee & Agency AB (publ) (reg.no. 556882-1879, P.O. Box 7329 SE-103 90 Stockholm, Sweden).

“**Trustee Agreement**” means the fee agreement entered into between the Trustee and the Issuer on or about the Issue Date regarding, *inter alia*, the remuneration payable to the Trustee.

“**Written Procedure**” means the written or electronic procedure for decision making among the Holders in accordance with Clause 16 (*Written Procedure*).

1.2 Construction

1.2.1 Unless a contrary indication appears, any reference in these Terms and Conditions to:

- (a) “**assets**” includes present and future properties, revenues and rights of every description;
- (b) any agreement or instrument is a reference to that agreement or instrument as supplemented, amended, novated, extended, restated or replaced from time to time;
- (c) a “**regulation**” includes any regulation, rule or official directive (whether or not having the force of law) of any governmental, intergovernmental or supranational body, agency or department;
- (d) a provision of law is a reference to that provision as amended or re-enacted; and
- (e) a time of day is a reference to Stockholm time.

1.2.2 An Event of Default is continuing if it has not been remedied or waived.

1.2.3 When ascertaining whether a limit or threshold specified in SEK has been attained or broken, an amount in another currency shall be counted on the basis of the rate of exchange for such currency against SEK for the previous Business Day, as published by the Swedish Central Bank (Sw. *Riksbanken*) on its website (www.riksbank.se). If no such rate is available, the most recently published rate shall be used instead.

1.2.4 A notice shall be deemed to be sent by way of press release if it is made available to the public within Sweden promptly and in a non-discriminatory manner.

1.2.5 No delay or omission of the Trustee or of any Holder to exercise any right or remedy under these Terms and Conditions shall impair or operate as a waiver of any such right or remedy.

2. THE AMOUNT OF THE BONDS AND UNDERTAKING TO MAKE PAYMENTS

2.1 The aggregate amount of the bond loan will be an amount of up to SEK 600,000,000 which will be represented by Bonds, each of a nominal amount of SEK 1,000,000 or full multiples thereof (the “**Nominal Amount**”). The total nominal amount of the Initial Bond is SEK 400,000,000 (the “**Initial Bond Issue**”). All Bonds issued in the Initial Bond Issue are issued on a fully paid basis at an issue price of one hundred (100.00) per cent. of the Nominal Amount. Bonds issued in the Initial Bond Issue in an aggregate Nominal Amount of SEK 150,000,000 may be paid for in kind by way of delivery of Outstanding Bonds, in accordance with a separate repurchase arrangement entered into by the Issuer.

2.2 The ISIN for the Bonds is SE0011337294.

2.3 The minimum permissible investment in connection with the Initial Bond Issue and any Subsequent Bond Issue is SEK 2,000,000.

2.4 The Issuer may at one or more occasions after the Issue Date issue Subsequent Bonds under these Terms and Conditions (each such issue, a “**Subsequent Bond Issue**”), until the total amount under such Subsequent Bond Issue(s) and the Initial Bond Issue equals SEK 600,000,000, always provided that (a) the Incurrence Test (calculated *pro forma* including such issue) is met and (b) no Event of Default is continuing or would result from (i) the expiry of a grace period, giving of notice, making of any determination or any combination of any of the foregoing or (ii) the issue of the Subsequent Bonds.

2.5 Any Subsequent Bonds shall be issued subject to the same Terms and Conditions and for the avoidance of doubt, the ISIN, the Interest Rate, the Nominal Amount and the Final Redemption Date applicable to the Bonds issued in the Initial Bond Issue shall also apply to Subsequent Bonds. The price of Subsequent Bonds may be set at the Nominal Amount, at a discount or at a higher price than the Nominal Amount

2.6 The Issuer undertakes to repay the Bonds, to pay Interest and to otherwise act in accordance and comply with these Terms and Conditions.

2.7 The Bonds are denominated in SEK and each Bond is constituted by these Terms and Conditions.

2.8 By subscribing for Bonds, each initial Holder agrees that the Bonds shall benefit from and be subject to these Terms and Conditions and by acquiring Bonds each subsequent Holder confirms these Terms and Conditions.

3. STATUS OF THE BONDS

The Bonds constitute direct, general, unconditional, unsubordinated and unsecured obligations of the Issuer and shall at all times rank at least *pari passu* with all direct, general, unconditional, unsubordinated and unsecured obligations of the Issuer, except

those obligations which are mandatorily preferred by law, and without any preference among them.

4. USE OF PROCEEDS

The Net Proceeds from the Initial Bond Issue or any Subsequent Bond Issue shall be used for general corporate purposes of the Group.

5. THE BONDS AND TRANSFERABILITY

- 5.1 Each Holder is bound by these Terms and Conditions without there being any further actions required to be taken or formalities to be complied with.
- 5.2 The Bonds are freely transferable. All Bond transfers are subject to these Terms and Conditions and these Terms and Conditions are automatically applicable in relation to all Bond transferees upon completed transfer.
- 5.3 Upon a transfer of Bonds, any rights and obligations under these Terms and Conditions relating to such Bonds are automatically transferred to the transferee.
- 5.4 No action is being taken in any jurisdiction that would or is intended to permit a public offering of the Bonds or the possession, circulation or distribution of any document or other material relating to the Issuer or the Bonds in any jurisdiction other than Sweden, where action for that purpose is required. Each Holder must inform itself about, and observe, any applicable restrictions to the transfer of material relating to the Issuer or the Bonds, (due to, *e.g.*, its nationality, its residency, its registered address or its place(s) of business). Each Holder must ensure compliance with such restrictions at its own cost and expense.
- 5.5 The Bonds have not been registered under the U.S. Securities Act of 1933, as amended (the “**Securities Act**”) and the Issuer is under no obligation to arrange for registration of the Bonds under the Securities Act or under any other law or regulation.
- 5.6 The Bonds are not offered to and may not be subscribed by investors located in the United States except for “Qualified Institutional Buyers” (“**QIB**”) within the meaning of Rule 144A under the Securities Act. In the application form relating to the Bonds, each person applying for the Bonds must confirm whether it is a U.S. person as defined in Rule 902 of Regulation S under the Securities Act, and if it is a U.S. person it must confirm, *inter alia*, that it is a QIB.
- 5.7 Holders located in the United States are not permitted to transfer Bonds except (a) subject to an effective registration statement under the Securities Act, (b) to a person that the Holder reasonably believes is a QIB within the meaning of Rule 144A that is purchasing for its own account, or the account of another QIB, to whom notice is given that the resale, pledge or other transfer may be made in reliance on Rule 144A, (c) outside the United States in accordance with Regulation S under the Securities Act, (d) pursuant to an exemption from registration under the Securities Act provided by Rule 144 thereunder (if available) and (e) pursuant to any other available exemption from registration under the Securities Act, subject to the receipt by the Issuer of an opinion of counsel or such other evidence that the Issuer may reasonably require confirming that such sale or transfer is in compliance with the Securities Act.

- 5.8 For the avoidance of doubt and notwithstanding the above, a Holder which allegedly has purchased Bonds in contradiction to mandatory restrictions applicable may nevertheless utilise its voting rights under these Terms and Conditions and shall be entitled to exercise its full rights as a Holder hereunder in each case until such allegations have been resolved.

6. BONDS IN BOOK-ENTRY FORM

- 6.1 The Bonds will be registered for the Holders on their respective Securities Accounts and no physical Bonds will be issued. Accordingly, the Bonds will be registered in accordance with the Central Securities Depositories and Financial Instruments Accounts Act. Registration requests relating to the Bonds shall be directed to an Account Operator.
- 6.2 Those who according to assignment, security, the provisions of the Swedish Children and Parents Code (Sw. *föräldrabalken (1949:381)*), conditions of will or deed of gift or otherwise have acquired a right to receive payments in respect of a Bond shall register their entitlements to receive payment in accordance with the Central Securities Depositories and Financial Instruments Accounts Act .
- 6.3 The Issuer (and the Trustee when permitted under the CSD's applicable regulations) shall be entitled to obtain information from the debt register (Sw. *skuldbok*) kept by the CSD in respect of the Bonds. At the request of the Trustee, the Issuer shall promptly obtain such information and provide it to the Trustee.
- 6.4 For the purpose of or in connection with any Holders' Meeting or any Written Procedure, the Issuing Agent shall be entitled to obtain information from the debt register kept by the CSD in respect of the Bonds. If the Trustee does not otherwise obtain information from such debt register as contemplated under these Terms and Conditions, the Issuing Agent shall at the request of the Trustee obtain information from the debt register and provide it to the Trustee.
- 6.5 The Issuer shall issue any necessary power of attorney to such persons employed by the Trustee, as notified by the Trustee, in order for such individuals to independently obtain information directly from the debt register kept by the CSD in respect of the Bonds. The Issuer may not revoke any such power of attorney unless directed by the Trustee or unless consent thereto is given by the Holders.
- 6.6 At the request of the Trustee, the Issuer shall promptly instruct the Issuing Agent to obtain information from the debt register kept by the CSD in respect of the Bonds and provide it to the Trustee.

7. RIGHT TO ACT ON BEHALF OF A HOLDER

- 7.1 If any Person other than a Holder wishes to exercise any rights under these Terms and Conditions, it must obtain a power of attorney (or, if applicable, a coherent chain of powers of attorney), a certificate from the authorised nominee or other sufficient proof of authorisation for such Person.
- 7.2 A Holder may issue one or several powers of attorney to third parties to represent it in relation to some or all of the Bonds held by it. Any such representative may act independently under these Terms and Conditions in relation to the Bonds for which such representative is

entitled to represent the Holder and may further delegate its right to represent the Holder by way of a further power of attorney.

- 7.3 The Trustee shall only have to examine the face of a power of attorney or other proof of authorisation that has been provided to it pursuant to Clause 7.1 and 7.2 and may assume that it has been duly authorised, is valid, has not been revoked or superseded and that it is in full force and effect, unless otherwise is apparent from its face.

8. PAYMENTS IN RESPECT OF THE BONDS

- 8.1 Any payment or repayment under these Terms and Conditions, or any amount due in respect of a repurchase of any Bonds, shall be made to such Person who is registered as a Holder on the Record Date prior to the relevant payment date, or to such other Person who is registered with the CSD on such date as being entitled to receive the relevant payment, repayment or repurchase amount.

- 8.2 If a Holder has registered, through an Account Operator, that principal, Interest and any other payment that shall be made under these Terms and Conditions shall be deposited in a certain bank account; such deposits will be effectuated by the CSD on the relevant payment date. In other cases, payments will be transferred by the CSD to the Holder at the address registered with the CSD on the Record Date. Should the CSD, due to a delay on behalf of the Issuer or some other obstacle, not be able to effectuate payments as aforesaid, the Issuer shall procure that such amounts are paid to the Persons who are registered as Holders on the relevant Record Date as soon as possible after such obstacle has been removed.

- 8.3 If, due to any obstacle for the CSD, the Issuer cannot make a payment or repayment, such payment or repayment may be postponed until the obstacle has been removed. Interest shall accrue in accordance with Clause 9.4 during such postponement.

- 8.4 If payment or repayment is made in accordance with this Clause 8, the Issuer and the CSD shall be deemed to have fulfilled their obligation to pay, irrespective of whether such payment was made to a Person not entitled to receive such amount.

- 8.5 The Issuer shall pay any stamp duty and other public fees accruing in connection with the Initial Bond Issue or a Subsequent Bond Issue, but not in respect of trading in the secondary market (except to the extent required by applicable law), and shall deduct at source any applicable withholding tax payable pursuant to law. The Issuer shall not be liable to reimburse any stamp duty or public fee or to gross-up any payments under these Terms and Conditions by virtue of any withholding tax, public levy or similar.

9. INTEREST

- 9.1 The Bonds will bear Interest at the Interest Rate applied to the Nominal Amount from, but excluding, the Issue Date up to and including the relevant Redemption Date. Any Subsequent Bond will carry Interest at the Interest Rate from (but excluding) the Interest Payment Date falling immediately prior to their issuance up to (and including) the relevant Redemption Date.

- 9.2 Interest accrues during an Interest Period. Payment of Interest in respect of the Bonds shall be made quarterly in arrears to the Holders on each Interest Payment Date for the preceding Interest Period.

9.3 Interest shall be calculated on the basis of a 360-day year comprised of twelve (12) months of thirty (30) days each and, in case of incomplete months, the actual number of days elapsed (30/360-days basis).

9.4 If the Issuer fails to pay any amount payable by it under these Terms and Conditions on its due date, default interest shall accrue on the overdue amount from, but excluding, the due date up to and including the date of actual payment at a rate which is two hundred (200) basis points higher than the Interest Rate. Accrued default interest shall not be capitalised. No default interest shall accrue where the failure to pay was solely attributable to the Trustee or the CSD, in which case the Interest Rate shall apply instead.

10. REDEMPTION AND REPURCHASE of the bonds

10.1 Redemption at maturity

The Issuer shall redeem all, but not only some, of the Bonds in full on the Final Redemption Date (or, to the extent such day is not a Business Day, on the first following Business Day) with an amount per Bond equal to the Nominal Amount together with accrued but unpaid Interest.

10.2 The Group Companies' purchase of Bonds

Any Group Company may, subject to applicable law, at any time and at any price purchase Bonds. The Bonds held by a Group Company may at such Group Company's discretion be retained, sold or, if held by the Issuer, be cancelled.

10.3 Early voluntary redemption by the Issuer (call option)

10.3.1 Provided that the Outstanding Bond has been redeemed in full (or shall be redeemed in full prior to, or in immediate connection with, a redemption of the Bonds in accordance with this Clause 10.3), the Issuer may redeem all, but not only some, of the Bonds in full on any Business Day before the Final Redemption Date, at the applicable Call Option Amount together with accrued but unpaid Interest.

10.3.2 Redemption in accordance with Clause 10.3.1 shall be made by the Issuer giving not less than fifteen (15) Business Days' notice to the Holders and the Trustee. Any such notice shall state the Redemption Date and the relevant Record Date and is irrevocable but may, at the Issuer's discretion, contain one or more conditions precedent. Upon expiry of such notice and the fulfilment of the conditions precedent (if any), the Issuer is bound to redeem the Bonds in full at the applicable amounts.

10.4 Mandatory repurchase due to a Change of Control Event or a De-listing Event (put option)

10.4.1 Upon a Change of Control Event or a De-listing Event occurring, each Holder shall have the right to request that all, or only some, of its Bonds are repurchased (whereby the Issuer shall have the obligation to repurchase such Bonds) at a price per Bond equal to one hundred one (101.00) per cent. of the Nominal Amount together with accrued but unpaid Interest; during a period of thirty (30) calendar days following a notice from the Issuer of the relevant event pursuant to Clause 11.9 (e). The thirty (30) calendar days' period may not start earlier than upon the occurrence of the Change of Control Event or the De-listing Event (as applicable).

- 10.4.2 The notice from the Issuer pursuant to Clause 11.9 (e) shall specify the repurchase date and include instructions about the actions that a Holder needs to take if it wants Bonds held by it to be repurchased. If a Holder has so requested, and acted in accordance with the instructions in the notice from the Issuer, the Issuer, or a Person designated by the Issuer, shall repurchase the relevant Bonds and the repurchase amount shall fall due on the repurchase date specified in the notice given by the Issuer pursuant to Clause 11.9 (e). The repurchase date must fall no later than twenty (20) Business Days after the end of the period referred to in Clause 10.4.1.
- 10.4.3 The Issuer shall comply with the requirements of any applicable securities laws or regulations in connection with the repurchase of Bonds. To the extent that the provisions of such laws and regulations conflict with the provisions in this Clause 10.4, the Issuer shall comply with the applicable securities laws and regulations and will not be deemed to have breached its obligations under this Clause 10.4 by virtue of the conflict.
- 10.4.4 Any Bonds repurchased by the Issuer pursuant to this Clause 10.4 may at the Issuer's discretion be retained, sold or cancelled in accordance with Clause 10.2.

11. SPECIAL UNDERTAKINGS

So long as any Bond remains outstanding, the Issuer undertakes to comply with the special undertakings set forth in this Clause 11.

11.1 Distributions

The Issuer shall not, and shall procure that none of the Subsidiaries, (i) pay any dividend in respect of its shares, (ii) make any contribution (other than contributions to Subsidiaries, (iii) repurchase or redeem any of its own shares, (iv) redeem or reduce its share capital or other restricted equity with repayment to shareholders, (v) make any prepayments under any long-term debt ranking junior or *pari passu* with the Bonds (other than in relation to loans between Subsidiaries and redemption of the Outstanding Bond in accordance with the terms and conditions for the Outstanding Bond), or (vi) make any other similar distribution or transfers of value to the Issuer's, or the Subsidiaries', direct and indirect shareholders or the Affiliates of such direct and indirect shareholders ((i)-(vi) each being a "Restricted Payment").

Notwithstanding the above, if permitted by law and no Event of Default is continuing or would result from such Restricted Payment:

- (a) any Restricted Payment may be made by any Group Company if such Restricted Payment is made to a Group Company and, if made by a Subsidiary which is not directly or indirectly wholly-owned by the Issuer, is made on a *pro rata* basis; or
- (b) any Restricted Payment may be made by the Issuer, provided that at the time of the payment the Incurrence Test is satisfied (calculated on a *pro forma* basis including the relevant payment).

11.2 **Nature of business**

The Issuer shall procure that no substantial change is made to the general nature of the business carried on by the Issuer and the Subsidiaries as of the Issue Date if such substantial change would have a Material Adverse Effect.

11.3 **Financial Indebtedness**

The Issuer shall not, and shall procure that none of the Subsidiaries will, incur any new Financial Indebtedness, or maintain or prolong any existing Financial Indebtedness, provided however that the Issuer and the Subsidiaries have a right to incur, maintain or prolong any Financial Indebtedness that constitutes Permitted Debt, if such Permitted Debt is incurred on market terms (or better).

11.4 **Negative Pledge**

The Issuer shall not, and shall procure that none of the Subsidiaries, provide, prolong or renew any security over any of its/their assets (present or future) to secure any loan or other indebtedness, provided however that the Group Companies have a right to provide, prolong and renew any Permitted Security.

11.5 **Disposal of assets**

The Issuer shall not, and shall procure that none of the Subsidiaries, sell or otherwise dispose of shares in any Subsidiary or of all or substantially all of its or any Subsidiary's assets or operations to any person not being the Issuer or any of its wholly-owned Subsidiaries, unless the transaction is carried out at fair market value and on terms and conditions customary for such transaction and provided that it does not have a Material Adverse Effect.

11.6 **Disposal of Avito.ru**

In the event that the Issuer disposes of more than fifty (50.00) per cent. of its holding in Avito.ru ("Avito"), the Issuer undertakes to, within thirty (30) Business Days of receipt of the proceeds from the disposal of Avito, either:

- (a) redeem all of the Bonds in full in accordance with these Terms and Conditions and redeem the Outstanding Bond in full in accordance with the terms and conditions for the Outstanding Bond; or
- (b) place an amount equivalent to the redemption amount required to redeem the Bonds and the Outstanding Bond as set out in paragraph (a) above (including, for the avoidance of doubt, any applicable premium payable on the redeemed Bonds and Outstanding Bond) on a blocked escrow account, pledged in favour of the Trustee (and the trustee for the Outstanding Bond) and the bondholders (represented by the Trustee and the trustee for the Outstanding Bond), where it shall remain until redemption of the Bonds and the Outstanding Bond. The funds standing on the credit of the escrow account may not be used for any other purpose than for redemption of the Bonds and the Outstanding Bond as set out in paragraph (a) above and shall, in the event of redemption, firstly be applied

towards redemption of the Outstanding Bond and secondly towards redemption of the Bonds.

11.7 **Dealings with related parties**

The Issuer shall, and shall procure that the Subsidiaries will, conduct all dealings with the direct and indirect shareholders of the Group Companies (excluding other Group Companies) and/or any Affiliates of such direct and indirect shareholders at arm's length terms.

11.8 **Compliance with laws etcetera**

The Issuer shall, and shall procure that the Subsidiaries, (i) comply in all material respects with all laws and regulations applicable from time to time, and (ii) obtain maintain and in all material respects comply with, the terms and conditions of any authorisation, approval, license or other permit required for the business carried out by the respective Group Company.

11.9 **Financial reporting etcetera**

The Issuer shall:

- (a) prepare and make available the annual audited consolidated financial statements of the Group and the annual audited unconsolidated financial statements of the Issuer, including a profit and loss account, a balance sheet, a cash flow statement and management commentary or report from the Issuer's board of directors, on its website not later than four (4) months after the expiry of each financial year;
- (b) prepare and make available the quarterly interim unaudited consolidated reports of the Group and the quarterly interim unaudited unconsolidated reports of the Issuer, including a profit and loss account, a balance sheet, a cash flow statement and management commentary or report from the Issuer's board of directors, on its website not later than two (2) months after the expiry of each relevant interim period;
- (c) issue a Compliance Certificate to the Trustee in connection with the delivery of a Financial Report or testing of the Incurrence Test (including any Subsequent Bond Issue);
- (d) keep the latest version of these Terms and Conditions available on the website of the Group;
- (e) promptly notify the Trustee (and, as regards a Change of Control Event or a De-listing Event, the Holders) when the Issuer is or becomes aware of a Change of Control Event or a De-listing Event or that an Event of Default has occurred, and provide the Trustee with such further information as the Trustee may request (acting reasonably) following receipt of such notice; and
- (f) prepare the Financial Reports in accordance with the IFRS and make them available in accordance with the rules and regulations of Nasdaq Stockholm (or any other regulated market, as applicable) (as amended from time to time) and

the Swedish Securities Market Act (Sw. lag (2007:528) om värdepappersmarknaden) (as amended from time to time).

- 11.9.1 The Issuer shall notify the Trustee of any transaction referred to in Clause 11.5 (*Disposals of assets*) and shall, upon request by the Trustee, provide the Trustee with (a) any information relating to the transaction which the Trustee deems necessary (acting reasonably) and (b) a determination from the Issuer which states whether the transaction is carried out at fair market value and on terms and conditions customary for such transaction or not and whether it has a Material Adverse Effect or not. The Trustee may assume that any information provided by the Issuer is correct, and the Trustee shall not be responsible or liable for the adequacy, accuracy or completeness of such information. The Trustee is not responsible for assessing if the transaction is carried out at fair market value and on terms and conditions customary for such transaction and whether it has a Material Adverse Effect, but is not bound by the Issuer's determination under item (b) above.

11.10 **Listing of Bonds**

The Issuer shall ensure that the Bonds issued in the Initial Bond Issue are listed at the corporate bond list on Nasdaq Stockholm not later than sixty (60) calendar days after the Issue Date (and with an intention to complete such listing within thirty (30) calendar days after the Issue Date) and shall take all measures required to ensure that the Bonds issued in the Initial Bond Issue (and any Bonds issued in a Subsequent Bond Issue as applicable), once listed on Nasdaq Stockholm, continue being listed on Nasdaq Stockholm for as long as any Bond is outstanding (however, taking into account the rules and regulations of Nasdaq Stockholm and the CSD (as amended from time to time) preventing trading in the Bonds in close connection to the redemption of the Bonds) and that, upon any Subsequent Bond Issue, the volume of Bonds listed on Nasdaq Stockholm promptly, but not later than fifteen (15) Business Days after the relevant issue date, is increased accordingly.

11.11 **Maintenance Test**

The Issuer shall ensure that the Maintenance Test is met for as long as any Bond is outstanding. The Maintenance Test shall be tested quarterly on the basis of the interim report for the period covered by the relevant Reference Date. The first test date for the Maintenance Test shall be 30 June 2018.

11.12 **Trustee Agreement**

11.12.1 The Issuer shall, in accordance with the Trustee Agreement:

- (a) pay fees to the Trustee;
- (b) indemnify the Trustee for costs, losses and liabilities;
- (c) furnish to the Trustee all information reasonably requested by or otherwise required to be delivered to the Trustee; and
- (d) not act in a way which would give the Trustee a legal or contractual right to terminate the Trustee Agreement.

11.12.2 The Issuer and the Trustee shall not agree to amend any provisions of the Trustee Agreement without the prior consent of the Holders if the amendment would be detrimental to the interests of the Holders.

11.13 **CSD related undertakings**

The Issuer shall keep the Bonds affiliated with a CSD and comply with all CSD regulation applicable to the Issuer from time to time.

12. Termination OF THE BONDS

12.1 The Trustee is entitled to, and shall following a demand in writing from a Holder (or Holders) representing at least fifty (50) per cent. of the Adjusted Nominal Amount (such demand may only be validly made by a person who is a Holder on the second Business Day following the day on which the demand is received by the Trustee and shall, if made by several Holders, be made by them jointly) or following an instruction or decision pursuant to Clause 12.6 or 12.7, on behalf of the Holders, terminate the Bonds and to declare all, but not only some, of the Bonds due for payment immediately or at such later date as the Trustee determines (such later date not falling later than twenty (20) Business Days from the date on which the Trustee made such declaration), if:

- (a) Non-payment: The Issuer fails to pay an amount on the date it is due in accordance with these Terms and Conditions unless its failure to pay is caused by administrative or technical error and payment is made within five (5) Business Days of the due date;
- (b) Other obligations: The Issuer does not comply with these Terms and Conditions, in any other way than as set out under (a) above, provided that the Trustee has requested the Issuer in writing to remedy such failure and the Issuer has not remedied the failure within fifteen (15) Business Days from such request (if the failure or violation is not capable of being remedied, the Trustee may declare the Bonds payable without such prior written request);
- (c) Cross-acceleration: Any Financial Indebtedness of a Material Group Company is not paid when due as extended by any originally applicable grace period, or is declared to be due and payable prior to its specified maturity as a result of an event of default (however described), provided that no Event of Default will occur under this paragraph (c) if the aggregate amount of Financial Indebtedness that has fallen due is less than SEK 15,000,000 and provided that it does not apply to any Financial Indebtedness owed to a Group Company;
- (d) Insolvency:
 - (i) Any Material Group Company is unable or admits inability to pay its debts as they fall due or is declared to be unable to pay its debts under applicable law, suspends making payments on its debts generally or, by reason of actual or anticipated financial difficulties, commences negotiations with its creditors with a view to rescheduling its Financial Indebtedness; or

- (ii) a moratorium is declared in respect of the Financial Indebtedness of any Material Group Company;
 - (e) Insolvency proceedings: Any corporate action, legal proceedings or other procedures are taken (other than (i) proceedings or petitions which are being disputed in good faith and are discharged, stayed or dismissed within sixty (60) calendar days of commencement or, if earlier, the date on which it is advertised and (ii), in relation to Subsidiaries, solvent liquidations) in relation to:
 - (i) the suspension of payments, winding-up, dissolution, administration or reorganisation (by way of voluntary agreement, scheme of arrangement or otherwise) of any Material Group Company; and
 - (ii) the appointment of a liquidator, receiver, administrator, administrative receiver, compulsory manager or other similar officer in respect of any Material Group Company or any of its assets or any analogous procedure or step is taken in any jurisdiction;
 - (f) Mergers and demergers: A decision is made that any Material Group Company shall be demerged or merged if such merger or demerger is likely to have a Material Adverse Effect, provided that a merger involving the Issuer, where the Issuer is not the surviving entity, shall always be considered an Event of Default and provided that the Issuer may not be demerged;
 - (g) Creditors' process: Any expropriation, attachment, sequestration, distress or execution or any analogous process in any jurisdiction affects any asset or assets of any Material Group Company having an aggregate value of an amount equal to or exceeding SEK 15,000,000 and is not discharged within sixty (60) calendar days;
 - (h) Impossibility or illegality: It is or becomes impossible or unlawful for the Issuer to fulfil or perform any of the provisions of these Terms and Conditions or if the obligations under these Terms and Conditions are not, or cease to be, legal, valid, binding and enforceable; or
 - (i) Continuation of the business: The Issuer or any other Material Group Company ceases to carry on its business if such discontinuation is likely to have a Material Adverse Effect.
- 12.2 The Trustee may not terminate the Bonds in accordance with Clause 12.1 by reference to a specific Event of Default if it is no longer continuing or if it has been decided, in accordance with these Terms and Conditions, to waive such Event of Default (temporarily or permanently). However, if a moratorium occurs, the ending of that moratorium will not prevent termination for payment prematurely on the ground mentioned under Clause 12.1.
- 12.3 If the right to terminate the Bonds is based upon a decision of a court of law or a government authority, it is not necessary that the decision has become enforceable under law or that the period of appeal has expired in order for cause of termination to be deemed to exist.
- 12.4 The Issuer is obliged to inform the Trustee immediately if any circumstance of the type specified in Clause 12.1 should occur. Should the Trustee not receive such information, the Trustee is entitled to assume that no such circumstance exists or can be expected to occur,

provided that the Trustee does not have knowledge of such circumstance. The Trustee is under no obligations to make any investigations relating to the circumstances specified in Clause 12.1. The Issuer shall further, at the request of the Trustee, provide the Trustee with details of any circumstances referred to in Clause 12.1 and provide the Trustee with all documents that may be of significance for the application of this Clause 12.

- 12.5 The Issuer is only obliged to inform the Trustee according to Clause 12.4 if informing the Trustee would not conflict with any statute or the Issuer's registration contract with Nasdaq Stockholm (or any other Regulated Market, as applicable). If such a conflict would exist pursuant to the listing contract with Nasdaq Stockholm or otherwise, the Issuer shall however be obliged to either seek the approval from Nasdaq Stockholm (or any other Regulated Market, as applicable) or undertake other reasonable measures, including entering into a non-disclosure agreement with the Trustee, in order to be able to timely inform the Trustee according to Clause 12.4.
- 12.6 If the Trustee has been notified by the Issuer or has otherwise determined that there is a default under these Terms and Conditions according to Clause 12.1, the Trustee shall (i) notify, within five (5) Business Days of the day of notification or determination, the Holders of the default and (ii) decide, within twenty (20) Business Days of the day of notification or determination, if the Bonds shall be declared terminated. If the Trustee has decided not to terminate the Bonds, the Trustee shall, at the earliest possible date, notify the Holders that there exists a right of termination and obtain instructions from the Holders according to the provisions in Clause 14 (*Decisions by Holders*). If the Holders vote in favour of termination and instruct the Trustee to terminate the Bonds, the Trustee shall promptly declare the Bonds terminated. However, if the cause for termination according to the Trustee's appraisal has ceased before the termination, the Trustee shall not terminate the Bonds. The Trustee shall in such case, at the earliest possible date, notify the Holders that the cause for termination has ceased. The Trustee shall always be entitled to take the time necessary to consider whether an occurred event constitutes an Event of Default.
- 12.7 If the Holders, without any prior initiative to decision from the Trustee or the Issuer, have made a decision regarding termination in accordance with Clause 14 (*Decisions by Holders*), the Trustee shall promptly declare the Bonds terminated. The Trustee is however not liable to take action if the Trustee considers cause for termination not to be at hand, unless the instructing Holders agree in writing to indemnify and hold the Trustee harmless from any loss or liability and, if requested by the Trustee in its discretion, grant sufficient security for such indemnity.
- 12.8 If the Bonds are declared due and payable in accordance with the provisions in this Clause 12, the Trustee shall take every reasonable measure necessary to recover the amounts outstanding under the Bonds.
- 12.9 For the avoidance of doubt, the Bonds cannot be terminated and become due for payment prematurely according to this Clause 12 without relevant decision by the Trustee or following instructions from the Holders' pursuant to Clause 14 (*Decisions by Holders*).
- 12.10 If the Bonds are declared due and payable in accordance with this Clause 12, the Issuer shall redeem all Bonds with an amount per Bond as set forth in the applicable Call Option Amount for the relevant period (plus accrued but unpaid interest).

13. DISTRIBUTION OF PROCEEDS

13.1 If the Bonds have been declared due and payable in accordance with Clause 12 (*Termination of the Bonds*), all payments by the Issuer relating to the Bonds shall be distributed in the following order of priority, in accordance with the instructions of the Trustee:

- (a) *firstly*, in or towards payment of the Trustee under the Trustee Agreement, including all costs and indemnities relating to the acceleration of the Bonds or the protection of the Holders' rights under these Terms and Conditions;
- (b) *secondly*, in or towards payment *pro rata* of accrued but unpaid Interest under the Bonds (Interest due on an earlier Interest Payment Date to be paid before any Interest due on a later Interest Payment Date);
- (c) *thirdly*, in or towards payment *pro rata* of any unpaid principal under the Bonds; and
- (d) *fourthly*, in or towards payment *pro rata* of any other costs or outstanding amounts unpaid under these Terms and Conditions.

Any excess funds after the application of proceeds in accordance with items (a) to (d) above shall be paid to the Issuer. The application of proceeds in accordance with items (a) to (d) above shall, however, not restrict a Holders' Meeting or a Written Procedure from resolving that accrued Interest (whether overdue or not) shall be reduced without a corresponding reduction of principal.

13.2 If a Holder or another party has paid any fees, costs, expenses or indemnities referred to in Clause 13.1, such Holder or other party shall be entitled to reimbursement by way of a corresponding distribution in accordance with Clause 13.1.

13.3 Funds that the Trustee receives (directly or indirectly) in connection with the termination of the Bonds constitute escrow funds according to the Escrow Funds Act and must be held on a separate interest-bearing account on behalf of the Holders and the other interested parties. The Trustee shall arrange for payments of such funds in accordance with this Clause 13 as soon as reasonably practicable.

13.4 If the Issuer or the Trustee shall make any payment under this Clause 13, the Issuer or the Trustee, as applicable, shall notify the Holders of any such payment at least fifteen (15) Business Days before the payment is made. Such notice shall specify the Record Date, the payment date and the amount to be paid. Notwithstanding the foregoing, for any Interest due but unpaid the Record Date specified in Clause 8.1 shall apply.

14. DECISIONS BY HOLDERS

14.1 A request by the Trustee for a decision by the Holders on a matter relating to these Terms and Conditions shall (at the option of the Trustee) be dealt with at a Holders' Meeting or by way of a Written Procedure.

14.2 Any request from the Issuer or a Holder (or Holders) representing at least ten (10.00) per cent. of the Adjusted Nominal Amount (such request may only be validly made by a Person who is a Holder on the Business Day immediately following the day on which the request is received by the Trustee and shall, if made by several Holders, be made by them jointly) for a decision by the Holders on a matter relating to these Terms and Conditions shall be directed

to the Trustee and dealt with at a Holders' Meeting or by way of a Written Procedure, as determined by the Trustee. The Person requesting the decision may suggest the form for decision making, but if it is in the Trustee's opinion more appropriate that a matter is dealt with at a Holders' Meeting than by way of a Written Procedure, it shall be dealt with at a Holders' Meeting.

14.3 The Trustee may refrain from convening a Holders' Meeting or instigating a Written Procedure if (a) the suggested decision must be approved by any Person in addition to the Holders and such Person has informed the Trustee that an approval will not be given, or (b) the suggested decision is not in accordance with applicable laws.

14.4 Only a Person who is, or who has been provided with a power of attorney or other proof of authorisation pursuant to Clause 7 (*Right to act on behalf of a Holder*) from a Person who is, registered as a Holder:

- (a) on the Record Date prior to the date of the Holders' Meeting, in respect of a Holders' Meeting, or
- (b) on the Business Day specified in the communication pursuant to Clause 16.3, in respect of a Written Procedure,

may exercise voting rights as a Holder at such Holders' Meeting or in such Written Procedure, provided that the relevant Bonds are included in the definition of Adjusted Nominal Amount.

14.5 The following matters shall require consent of Holders representing at least two thirds (2/3) of the Adjusted Nominal Amount for which Holders are voting at a Holders' Meeting or for which Holders reply in a Written Procedure in accordance with the instructions given pursuant to Clause 16.3:

- (a) waive a breach of or amend an undertaking set out in Clause 11 (*Special undertakings*);
- (b) a mandatory exchange of Bonds for other securities;
- (c) reduce the principal amount, Interest Rate or Interest which shall be paid by the Issuer;
- (d) amend any payment day for principal or Interest or waive any breach of a payment undertaking, or
- (e) amend the provisions in this Clause 14.5 or 14.6.

14.6 Any matter not covered by Clause 14.5 shall require the consent of Holders representing more than fifty (50.00) per cent. of the Adjusted Nominal Amount for which Holders are voting at a Holders' Meeting or for which Holders reply in a Written Procedure in accordance with the instructions given pursuant to Clause 16.3. This includes, but is not limited to, any amendment to or waiver of these Terms and Conditions that does not require a higher majority (other than an amendment permitted pursuant to Clause 17.1(a), (b) or (c)), or a termination of the Bonds.

- 14.7 If the number of votes or replies are equal, the opinion which is most beneficial for the Issuer, according to the chairman at a Holders' Meeting or the Trustee in a Written Procedure, will prevail.
- 14.8 Quorum at a Holders' Meeting or in respect of a Written Procedure only exists if a Holder (or Holders) representing at least twenty (20.00) per cent. of the Adjusted Nominal Amount;
- (a) if at a Holders' Meeting, attend the meeting in person or by telephone conference (or appear through duly authorised representatives); or
 - (b) if in respect of a Written Procedure, reply to the request.
- 14.9 If a quorum does not exist at a Holders' Meeting or in respect of a Written Procedure, the Trustee or the Issuer shall convene a second Holders' Meeting (in accordance with Clause 15.1) or initiate a second Written Procedure (in accordance with Clause 16.1), as the case may be, provided that the relevant proposal has not been withdrawn by the Person(s) who initiated the procedure for Holders' consent. The quorum requirement in Clause 14.8 shall not apply to such second Holders' Meeting or Written Procedure.
- 14.10 Any decision which extends or increases the obligations of the Issuer or the Trustee, or limits, reduces or extinguishes the rights or benefits of the Issuer or the Trustee, under these Terms and Conditions shall be subject to the Issuer's or the Trustee's consent, as appropriate.
- 14.11 A Holder holding more than one Bond need not use all its votes or cast all the votes to which it is entitled in the same way and may in its discretion use or cast some of its votes only.
- 14.12 The Issuer may not, directly or indirectly, pay or cause to be paid any consideration to or for the benefit of any Holder for or as inducement to any consent under these Terms and Conditions, unless such consideration is offered to all Holders that consent at the relevant Holders' Meeting or in a Written Procedure within the time period stipulated for the consideration to be payable or the time period for replies in the Written Procedure, as the case may be.
- 14.13 A matter decided at a duly convened and held Holders' Meeting or by way of Written Procedure is binding on all Holders, irrespective of them being present or represented at the Holders' Meeting or responding in the Written Procedure. The Holders that have not adopted or voted for a decision shall not be liable for any damages that this may cause other Holders.
- 14.14 All costs and expenses incurred by the Issuer or the Trustee for the purpose of convening a Holders' Meeting or for the purpose of carrying out a Written Procedure, including reasonable fees to the Trustee, shall be paid by the Issuer.
- 14.15 If a decision shall be taken by the Holders on a matter relating to these Terms and Conditions, the Issuer shall promptly at the request of the Trustee provide the Trustee with a certificate specifying the number of Bonds owned by Group Companies or (to the knowledge of the Issuer) their Affiliates, irrespective of whether such Person is directly registered as owner of such Bonds. The Trustee shall not be responsible for the accuracy of such certificate or otherwise be responsible to determine whether a Bond is owned by a Group Company or an Affiliate of a Group Company.
- 14.16 Information about decisions taken at a Holders' Meeting or by way of a Written Procedure shall promptly be sent by notice to the Holders and published on the websites of the Issuer

and the Trustee, provided that a failure to do so shall not invalidate any decision made or voting result achieved. The minutes from the relevant Holders' Meeting or Written Procedure shall at the request of a Holder be sent to it by the Issuer or the Trustee, as applicable.

15. HOLDERS' MEETING

- 15.1 The Trustee shall convene a Holders' Meeting by sending a notice thereof to each Holder no later than five (5) Business Days after receipt of a request from the Issuer or the Holder(s) (or such later date as may be necessary for technical or administrative reasons). If the Holder's Meeting has been requested by the Holder(s), the Trustee shall send a copy of the notice to the Issuer.
- 15.2 Should the Issuer want to replace the Trustee, it may convene a Holders' Meeting in accordance with Clause 15.1 with a copy to the Trustee. After a request from the Holders pursuant to Clause 18.4.3, the Issuer shall no later than five (5) Business Days after receipt of such request (or such later date as may be necessary for technical or administrative reasons) convene a Holders' Meeting in accordance with Clause 15.1.
- 15.3 The notice pursuant to Clause 15.1 shall include (a) time for the meeting, (b) place for the meeting, (c) agenda for the meeting (including each request for a decision by the Holders) and (d) a form of power of attorney. Only matters that have been included in the notice may be resolved upon at the Holders' Meeting. Should prior notification by the Holders be required in order to attend the Holders' Meeting, such requirement shall be included in the notice.
- 15.4 The Holders' Meeting shall be held no earlier than ten (10) Business Days and no later than twenty (20) Business Days from the notice.
- 15.5 If the Trustee, in breach of these Terms and Conditions, has not convened a Holders' Meeting within five (5) Business Days after having received such notice, the requesting Person may convene the Holders' Meeting itself. If the requesting Person is a Holder, the Issuer shall upon request from such Holder provide the Holder with necessary information from the register kept by the CSD and, if no Person to open the Holders' Meeting has been appointed by the Trustee, the meeting shall be opened by a Person appointed by the requesting Person.
- 15.6 At a Holders' Meeting, the Issuer, the Holders (or the Holders' representatives/proxies) and the Trustee may attend along with each of their representatives, counsels and assistants. Further, the directors of the board, the managing director and other officials of the Issuer and the Issuer's auditors may attend the Holders' Meeting. The Holders' Meeting may decide that further individuals may attend. If a representative/proxy shall attend the Holders' Meeting instead of the Holder, the representative/proxy shall present a duly executed proxy or other document establishing its authority to represent the Holder.
- 15.7 Without amending or varying these Terms and Conditions, the Trustee may prescribe such further regulations regarding the convening and holding of a Holders' Meeting as the Trustee may deem appropriate. Such regulations may include a possibility for Holders to vote without attending the meeting in person.

16. WRITTEN PROCEDURE

- 16.1 The Trustee shall instigate a Written Procedure no later than five (5) Business Days after receipt of a request from the Issuer or the Holder(s) (or such later date as may be necessary for technical or administrative reasons) by sending a communication to each such Person who is registered as a Holder on the Business Day prior to the date on which the communication is sent. If the Written Procedure has been requested by the Holder(s), the Trustee shall send a copy of the communication to the Issuer.
- 16.2 Should the Issuer want to replace the Trustee, it may send a communication in accordance with Clause 16.1 to each Holder with a copy to the Trustee.
- 16.3 A communication pursuant to Clause 16.1 shall include (a) each request for a decision by the Holders, (b) a description of the reasons for each request, (c) a specification of the Business Day on which a Person must be registered as a Holder in order to be entitled to exercise voting rights, (d) instructions and directions on where to receive a form for replying to the request (such form to include an option to vote yes or no for each request) as well as a form of power of attorney, and (e) the stipulated time period within which the Holder must reply to the request (such time period to last at least ten (10) Business Days but not more than twenty (20) Business Days from the communication pursuant to Clause 16.1). If the voting shall be made electronically, instructions for such voting shall be included in the communication.
- 16.4 If the Trustee, in breach of these Terms and Conditions, has not instigated a Written Procedure within five (5) Business Days after having received such notice, the requesting Person may instigate a Written Procedure itself. If the requesting Person is a Holder, the Issuer shall upon request from such Holder provide the Holder with necessary information from the register kept by the CSD.
- 16.5 When the requisite majority consents of the Adjusted Nominal Amount pursuant to Clauses 14.5 and 14.6 have been received in a Written Procedure, the relevant decision shall be deemed to be adopted pursuant to Clause 14.5 or 14.6, as the case may be, even if the time period for replies in the Written Procedure has not yet expired.

17. AMENDMENTS AND WAIVERS

- 17.1 The Issuer and the Trustee (acting on behalf of the Holders) may agree to amend these Terms and Conditions or waive any provision in these Terms and Conditions, provided that:
- (a) such amendment or waiver is not detrimental to the interest of the Holders, or is made solely for the purpose of rectifying obvious errors and mistakes;
 - (b) such amendment or waiver is required by applicable law, a court ruling or a decision by a relevant authority;
 - (c) such amendment or waiver is necessary for the purpose of listing the Bonds on the corporate bond list of Nasdaq Stockholm provided such amendment or waiver does not materially adversely affect the rights of the Holders; or
 - (d) such amendment or waiver has been duly approved by the Holders in accordance with Clause 14 (*Decisions by Holders*).

- 17.2 The consent of the Holders is not necessary to approve the particular form of any amendment or waiver to these Terms and Conditions. It is sufficient if such consent approves the substance of the amendment or waiver.
- 17.3 The Trustee shall promptly notify the Holders of any amendments or waivers made in accordance with Clause 17.1, setting out the date from which the amendment or waiver will be effective, and ensure that any amendments to these Terms and Conditions are available on the websites of the Issuer and the Trustee. The Issuer shall ensure that any amendments to these Terms and Conditions are duly registered with the CSD and each other relevant organisation or authority.
- 17.4 An amendment or waiver to these Terms and Conditions shall take effect on the date determined by the Holders Meeting, in the Written Procedure or by the Trustee, as the case may be.

18. APPOINTMENT AND REPLACEMENT OF THE TRUSTEE

18.1 Appointment of Trustee

- 18.1.1 By subscribing for Bonds, each initial Holder appoints the Trustee to act as its agent in all matters relating to the Bonds and these Terms and Conditions, and authorises the Trustee to act on its behalf (without first having to obtain its consent, unless such consent is specifically required by these Terms and Conditions) in any legal or arbitration proceedings relating to the Bonds held by such Holder, including the winding-up, dissolution, liquidation, company reorganisation (Sw. *företagsrekonstruktion*), or bankruptcy (Sw. *konkurs*) (or its equivalent in any other jurisdiction) of the Issuer. By acquiring Bonds, each subsequent Holder confirms such appointment and authorisation for the Trustee to act on its behalf.
- 18.1.2 Each Holder shall immediately upon request by the Trustee provide the Trustee with any such documents, including a written power of attorney (in form and substance satisfactory to the Trustee), as the Trustee deems necessary for the purpose of exercising its rights and/or carrying out its duties under these Terms and Conditions. The Trustee is under no obligation to represent a Holder which does not comply with such request.
- 18.1.3 The Issuer shall promptly upon request provide the Trustee with any documents and other assistance (in form and substance satisfactory to the Trustee), that the Trustee deems necessary for the purpose of exercising its rights and/or carrying out its duties under these Terms and Conditions.
- 18.1.4 The Trustee is entitled to fees for its work and to be indemnified for costs, losses and liabilities on the terms set out in these Terms and Conditions and the Trustee Agreement and the Trustee's obligations as agent under these Terms and Conditions are conditioned upon the due payment of such fees and indemnifications.
- 18.1.5 The Trustee may act as agent and/or security agent for several issues of securities issued by or relating to the Issuer and Group Companies notwithstanding potential conflicts of interest.

18.2 Duties of the Trustee

- 18.2.1 The Trustee shall represent the Holders in accordance with these Terms and Conditions. However, the Trustee is not responsible for the execution or enforceability of these Terms

- and Conditions. The Trustee shall keep the latest version of these Terms and Conditions (including any document amending these Terms and Conditions) available on the website of the Trustee.
- 18.2.2 The Trustee shall upon request by a Holder disclose the identity of any other Holder who has consented to the Trustee in doing so.
- 18.2.3 When acting in accordance with these Terms and Conditions, the Trustee is always acting with binding effect on behalf of the Holders. The Trustee shall carry out its duties under these Terms and Conditions in a reasonable, proficient and professional manner, with reasonable care and skill.
- 18.2.4 The Trustee is entitled to delegate its duties to other professional parties, but the Trustee shall remain liable for the actions of such parties under these Terms and Conditions.
- 18.2.5 The Trustee shall treat all Holders equally and, when acting pursuant to these Terms and Conditions, act with regard only to the interests of the Holders and shall not be required to have regard to the interests or to act upon or comply with any direction or request of any other Person, other than as explicitly stated in these Terms and Conditions and the Trustee Agreement.
- 18.2.6 The Trustee shall be entitled to disclose to the Holders any event or circumstance directly or indirectly relating to the Issuer or the Bonds. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Trustee may if it considers it to be beneficial to the interests of the Holders delay disclosure or refrain from disclosing certain information other than in respect of an Event of Default that has occurred and is continuing.
- 18.2.7 The Trustee is entitled to engage external experts when carrying out its duties under these Terms and Conditions. The Issuer shall on demand by the Trustee pay all costs for external experts engaged (a) after the occurrence of an Event of Default, (b) for the purpose of investigating or considering an event which the Trustee reasonably believes is or may lead to an Event of Default or a matter relating to the Issuer which the Trustee reasonably believes may be detrimental to the interests of the Holders under these Terms and Conditions or (c) when the Trustee is to make a determination under these Terms and Conditions. Any compensation for damages or other recoveries received by the Trustee from external experts engaged by it for the purpose of carrying out its duties under these Terms and Conditions shall be distributed in accordance with Clause 13 (*Distribution of proceeds*).
- 18.2.8 The Trustee shall enter into agreements with the CSD, and comply with such agreement and the CSD regulations applicable to the Trustee, as may be necessary in order for the Trustee to carry out its duties under these Terms and Conditions.
- 18.2.9 Notwithstanding any other provision of these Terms and Conditions to the contrary, the Trustee is not obliged to do or omit to do anything if it would or might in its reasonable opinion constitute a breach of any law or regulation.
- 18.2.10 If in the Trustee's reasonable opinion the cost, loss or liability which it may incur (including reasonable fees to the Trustee) in complying with instructions of the Holders, or taking any action at its own initiative, will not be covered by the Issuer, the Trustee may refrain from acting in accordance with such instructions, or taking such action, until it has received such

funding or indemnities (or adequate security has been provided therefore) as it may reasonably require.

- 18.2.11 The Trustee shall give a notice to the Holders (a) before it ceases to perform its obligations under these Terms and Conditions by reason of the non-payment by the Issuer of any fee or indemnity due to the Trustee under these Terms and Conditions or the Trustee Agreement, or (b) if it refrains from acting for any reason described in Clause 18.2.10.

18.3 **Limited liability for the Trustee**

- 18.3.1 The Trustee will not be liable to the Holders for damage or loss caused by any action taken or omitted by it under or in connection with these Terms and Conditions, unless directly caused by its negligence or wilful misconduct. The Trustee shall never be responsible for indirect loss.

- 18.3.2 The Trustee shall not be considered to have acted negligently if it has acted in accordance with advice from or opinions of reputable external experts engaged by the Trustee or if the Trustee has acted with reasonable care in a situation when the Trustee considers that it is detrimental to the interests of the Holders to delay the action in order to first obtain instructions from the Holders.

- 18.3.3 The Trustee shall not be liable for any delay (or any related consequences) in crediting an account with an amount required pursuant to these Terms and Conditions to be paid by the Trustee to the Holders, provided that the Trustee has taken all necessary steps as soon as reasonably practicable to comply with the regulations or operating procedures of any recognised clearing or settlement system used by the Trustee for that purpose.

- 18.3.4 The Trustee shall have no liability to the Holders for damage caused by the Trustee acting in accordance with instructions of the Holders given in accordance with Clause 14 (*Decisions by Holders*).

- 18.3.5 Any liability towards the Issuer which is incurred by the Trustee in acting under, or in relation to, these Terms and Conditions shall not be subject to set-off against the obligations of the Issuer to the Holders under these Terms and Conditions.

18.4 **Replacement of the Trustee**

- 18.4.1 Subject to Clause 18.4.6, the Trustee may resign by giving notice to the Issuer and the Holders, in which case the Holders shall appoint a successor Trustee at a Holders' Meeting convened by the retiring Trustee or by way of Written Procedure initiated by the retiring Trustee.

- 18.4.2 Subject to Clause 18.4.6, if the Trustee is insolvent or becomes subject to bankruptcy proceedings, the Trustee shall be deemed to resign as Trustee and the Issuer shall within ten (10) Business Days appoint a successor Trustee which shall be an independent financial institution or other reputable company which regularly acts as agent under debt issuances.

- 18.4.3 A Holder (or Holders) representing at least ten (10.00) per cent. of the Adjusted Nominal Amount may, by notice to the Issuer (such notice may only be validly given by a Person who is a Holder on the Business Day immediately following the day on which the notice is received by the Issuer and shall, if given by several Holders, be given by them jointly),

require that a Holders' Meeting is held for the purpose of dismissing the Trustee and appointing a new Trustee. The Issuer may, at a Holders' Meeting convened by it or by way of Written Procedure initiated by it, propose to the Holders that the Trustee be dismissed and a new Trustee appointed.

- 18.4.4 If the Holders have not appointed a successor Trustee within ninety (90) calendar days after (a) the earlier of the notice of resignation was given or the resignation otherwise took place or (b) the Trustee was dismissed through a decision by the Holders, the Issuer shall appoint a successor Trustee which shall be an independent financial institution or other reputable company which regularly acts as agent under debt issuances.
- 18.4.5 The retiring Trustee shall, at its own cost, make available to the successor Trustee such documents and records and provide such assistance as the successor Trustee may reasonably request for the purposes of performing its functions as Trustee under these Terms and Conditions.
- 18.4.6 The Trustee's resignation or dismissal shall only take effect upon the appointment of a successor Trustee and acceptance by such successor Trustee of such appointment and the execution of all necessary documentation to effectively substitute the retiring Trustee.
- 18.4.7 Upon the appointment of a successor, the retiring Trustee shall be discharged from any further obligation in respect of these Terms and Conditions but shall remain entitled to the benefit of these Terms and Conditions and remain liable under these Terms and Conditions in respect of any action which it took or failed to take whilst acting as Trustee. Its successor, the Issuer and each of the Holders shall have the same rights and obligations amongst themselves under these Terms and Conditions as they would have had if such successor had been the original Trustee.
- 18.4.8 In the event that there is a change of the Trustee in accordance with this Clause 18.4, the Issuer shall execute such documents and take such actions as the new Trustee may reasonably require for the purpose of vesting in such new Trustee the rights, powers and obligation of the Trustee and releasing the retiring Trustee from its further obligations under these Terms and Conditions. Unless the Issuer and the new Trustee agrees otherwise, the new Trustee shall be entitled to the same fees and the same indemnities as the retiring Trustee.

19. APPOINTMENT AND REPLACEMENT OF THE ISSUING AGENT

- 19.1 The Issuer appoints the Issuing Agent to manage certain specified tasks under these Terms and Conditions and in accordance with the legislation, rules and regulations applicable to and/or issued by the CSD and relating to the Bonds.
- 19.2 The Issuing Agent may retire from its assignment or be dismissed by the Issuer, provided that the Issuer has approved that a commercial bank or securities institution approved by the CSD accedes as new Issuing Agent at the same time as the old Issuing Agent retires or is dismissed. If the Issuing Agent is insolvent, the Issuer shall immediately appoint a new Issuing Agent, which shall replace the old Issuing Agent as issuing agent in accordance with these Terms and Conditions.

20. APPOINTMENT AND REPLACEMENT OF THE CSD

- 20.1 The Issuer has appointed the CSD to manage certain tasks under these Terms and Conditions and in accordance with the legislation, rules and regulations applicable to the CSD.
- 20.2 The CSD may retire from its assignment or be dismissed by the Issuer, provided that the Issuer has effectively appointed a replacement CSD that accedes as CSD at the same time as the old CSD retires or is dismissed and provided also that the replacement does not have a negative effect on any Holder or the listing of the Bonds listed on the corporate bond list of Nasdaq Stockholm. The replacing CSD must be authorised to professionally conduct clearing operations pursuant to the Swedish Securities Market Act (*Sw. lag (2007:528) om värdepappersmarknaden*).

21. NO DIRECT ACTIONS BY HOLDERS

- 21.1 A Holder may not take any steps whatsoever against the Issuer or a Subsidiary to enforce or recover any amount due or owing to it pursuant to these Terms and Conditions, or to initiate, support or procure the winding-up, dissolution, liquidation, company reorganisation (*Sw. företagsrekonstruktion*) or bankruptcy (*Sw. konkurs*) (or its equivalent in any other jurisdiction) of the Issuer or a Subsidiary in relation to any of the liabilities of the Issuer or a Subsidiary under these Terms and Conditions. Such steps may only be taken by the Trustee.
- 21.2 Clause 21.1 shall not apply if the Trustee has been instructed by the Holders in accordance with these Terms and Conditions to take certain actions but fails for any reason to take, or is unable to take (for any reason other than a failure by a Holder to provide documents in accordance with Clause 18.1.2), such actions within a reasonable period of time and such failure or inability is continuing. However, if the failure to take certain actions is caused by the non-payment by the Issuer of any fee or indemnity due to the Trustee under these Terms and Conditions or the Trustee Agreement or by any reason described in Clause 18.2.10, such failure must continue for at least forty (40) Business Days after notice pursuant to Clause 18.2.11 before a Holder may take any action referred to in Clause 21.1.
- 21.3 The provisions of Clause 21.1 shall not in any way limit an individual Holder's right to claim and enforce payments which are due to it under Clause 10.4 (*Mandatory repurchase due to a Change of Control Event or a De-listing Event (put option)*) or other payments which are due by the Issuer to some but not all Holders.

22. TIME-BAR

- 22.1 The right to receive repayment of the principal of the Bonds shall be time-barred and become void ten (10) years from the relevant Redemption Date. The right to receive payment of Interest (excluding any capitalised Interest) shall be time-barred and become void three (3) years from the relevant due date for payment. The Issuer is entitled to any funds set aside for payments in respect of which the Holders' right to receive payment has been time-barred and has become void.
- 22.2 If a limitation period is duly interrupted in accordance with the Swedish Act on Limitations (*Sw. preskriptionslag (1981:130)*), a new time-bar period of ten (10) years with respect to the right to receive repayment of the principal of the Bonds, and of three (3) years with respect to the right to receive payment of Interest (excluding capitalised Interest) will

commence, in both cases calculated from the date of interruption of the time-bar period, as such date is determined pursuant to the provisions of the Swedish Act on Limitations.

23. NOTICES AND PRESS RELEASES

23.1 Notices

23.1.1 Any notice or other communication to be made under or in connection with these Terms and Conditions:

- (a) if to the Trustee, shall be given at the address registered with the Swedish Companies Registration Office (Sw. *Bolagsverket*) on the Business Day prior to dispatch or, if sent by email by the Issuer, to such email address as notified by the Trustee to the Issuer from time to time;
- (b) if to the Issuer, shall be given at the address registered with the Swedish Companies Registration Office on the Business Day prior to dispatch or, if sent by email by the Trustee, to such email address as notified by the Issuer to the Trustee from time to time; and
- (c) if to the Holders, shall be given at their addresses as registered with the CSD (or in relation to courier or personal delivery, if such address is a box address, the addressee reasonably assumed to be associated with such box address), on the Business Day prior to dispatch, and by either courier delivery or letter for all Holders. A notice to the Holders shall also be published on the websites of the Issuer and the Trustee.

23.1.2 Any notice or other communication made by one person to another under or in connection with these Terms and Conditions shall be sent by way of courier, personal delivery or letter (and, if between the Trustee and the Issuer, by email) and will only be effective, in case of courier or personal delivery, when it has been left at the address specified in Clause 23.1.1 or, in case of letter, three (3) Business Days after being deposited postage prepaid in an envelope addressed to the address specified in Clause 23.1.1 or, in case of email to the Trustee or the Issuer, when received in legible form by the email address specified in Clause 23.1.1.

23.1.3 Failure to send a notice or other communication to a Holder or any defect in it shall not affect its sufficiency with respect to other Holders.

23.2 Press releases

23.2.1 Any notice that the Issuer or the Trustee shall send to the Holders pursuant to Clauses 10.3, 10.4, 11.9 (e), 12.6, 13.4, 14.16, 15.1, 16.1, 17.3, 18.2.11 and 18.4.1 shall also be published by way of press release by the Issuer or the Trustee, as applicable.

23.2.2 In addition to Clause 23.2.1, if any information relating to the Bonds, the Issuer or the Group contained in a notice that the Trustee may send to the Holders under these Terms and Conditions has not already been made public by way of a press release, the Trustee shall before it sends such information to the Holders give the Issuer the opportunity to issue a press release containing such information. If the Issuer does not promptly issue a press release and the Trustee considers it necessary to issue a press release containing such

information before it can lawfully send a notice containing such information to the Holders, the Trustee shall be entitled to issue such press release.

24. FORCE MAJEURE AND LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

- 24.1 Neither the Trustee nor the Issuing Agent shall be held responsible for any damage arising out of any legal enactment, or any measure taken by a public authority, or war, strike, lockout, boycott, blockade or any other similar circumstance (a “**Force Majeure Event**”). The reservation in respect of strikes, lockouts, boycotts and blockades applies even if the Trustee or the Issuing Agent itself takes such measures, or is subject to such measures.
- 24.2 The Issuing Agent shall have no liability to the Holders if it has observed reasonable care. The Issuing Agent shall never be responsible for indirect damage with exception of gross negligence and wilful misconduct.
- 24.3 Should a Force Majeure Event arise which prevents the Trustee or the Issuing Agent from taking any action required to comply with these Terms and Conditions, such action may be postponed until the obstacle has been removed.
- 24.4 The provisions in this Clause 24 apply unless they are inconsistent with the provisions of the Central Securities Depositories and Financial Instruments Accounts Act which provisions shall take precedence.

25. GOVERNING LAW AND JURISDICTION

- 25.1 These Terms and Conditions, and any non-contractual obligations arising out of or in connection therewith, shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of Sweden.
- 25.2 Any dispute or claim arising in relation to these Terms and Conditions shall, subject to Clause 25.3, be determined by Swedish courts and the District Court of Stockholm shall be the court of first instance.
- 25.3 The submission to the jurisdiction of the Swedish courts shall not limit the right of the Trustee (or the Holders, as applicable) to take proceedings against the Issuer in any court which may otherwise exercise jurisdiction over the Issuer or any of its assets.
